

Ship Hibernia at Sea V. P. Lemmon Master

March 1845

Friday the 7th

Fine breezes from S by W ship heading S by E
with a head sea saw a head of W. W. W.
pink middle and latter part heading S by E
and W by E light winds and good weather

At 4 P.M. This Day Discovered a Island ^{Lat 11° 20' N}
bearing N by W Distance about 4 leagues, very low
and about 39 miles in length not layed down
on the Chart ^{Long 158° 49'}
^{some land} ^{rocks} ^{land} ^{N. E. Point}

Christmas Is is layed down Lat 11° 58' Long 158° 41' 32"

March 1845

Saturday the 8th

Fine breezes and good weather heading
S by E middle and latter part wind and
weather the same heading S and S by W
^{Lat 31° 04'}
^{Long 157° 37'}

March 1845

Sunday the 9th

Fresh breezes from S by W ship heading
N by W with all sail set middle part
the same took in fore and mizzen top
gallant sails and flying jib latter part
singing reefed the topsails strong
breezes heading S by W
^{Lat 5° 06'}
^{Long 158° 18'}

Ship Hibernia Bound to the Sandwich Islands

March 1845

Monday the 10th

Strong breezes and squally ship heading
N by W under double reefed topsails
jib and courses, split the flying jib
latter part light breezes and fine weather
ship heading S by W employed
in mending the flying jib

^{Lat 6° 26'}
^{Long 158° 56'}

March 1845

Tuesday the 11th

Light breezes ship heading S by W
with all sail set in bent the flying
jib and got up water middle and
latter part light breezes and fine weather
ship heading S by W and S by W this
day dried and bunched our beam
sails
^{Lat 7° 39'}
^{Long 157° 45'}

March 1845

Wednesday the 12th

Light breezes and fine weather at 5 P.M.
took ship heading S middle and latter
part the same employed in several jobs
^{Lat 7° 38'}
^{Long 158° 34'}
^{Long 158° 41'}
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
