

Ship Hibernia at Sea and Bound to the Sandwich Islands

March 1845

Wednesday the 19th

Fresh breezes from S E steering N W E at 45 M
N E & middle part wind S and fresh at 9 M
saw Oahyhee bearing N W distance 20 miles latter
part a light gale took in sail the loaded reefed
broadly got up one cable and bent it and got the
Anchor ready so as to steer along with the
land here over Board more meat and
found more that want to go

March 1845

Thursday the 20th

At 1 P M got under the lee of the Island
light winds and bawling with some rain
at 5 P M cleared up saw Mowee bearing N
saw a sail standing along with us made
sail wind N W E at 7 P M tacked ship
to the Eastward at 10 to the northward at 3 A M
to the N E latter part calm so ends

March 1845

Friday the 21st

Fresh breezes from N W W with a head
as usual standing on different tack leaving
3 sail in sight bearing at 8 P M Mowee
bearing N W W distance about 30 miles Cook
latter middle and latter part calm employed
in fitting casks for water so ends
land in sight

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March 1845

Saturday the 22nd

A light air from the northward steering
N W W for Mowee 2 sail in sight
middle and latter part a light breeze
from E steering W for Mowee so ends
Cook on duty
this day washed ship out side

March 1845

Sunday the 23rd

A light breeze from the Eastward steering
along with the land at 7 P M got the up
the larboard cable and bent it and got the
anchor ready saw a Schooner standing
out middle part light air steering in
for the harbor at 10 M M got anchor
in 19 fathoms of water the weight on
spoke Starboard 40 sail lying at anchor
they had a severe gale last Monday
all ship their cable and went to sea
but the one the Cleveus some damage
done to several ships no lives lost
