

Ship Hibernia at Sea N^o D^o Simmons master

April 1845

Thursday the 17th

Light breeze from S steering N with all sail set
employed in mending old boats and other necessary
jobs middle part fine weather at 6 A M saw a small
breach hauld to the wind but saw it no more
this day ends with fresh breezes from S by steering
N by W so ends

Lat 35° 35'

April 1845

Friday the 18th

Fresh breezes from S steering N by N at 3 P M wind
hauld to the Northward with light rain middle
part calm & latter part a light breeze from N by E
ship heading N by W Lat 36° 37'

April 1845

Saturday the 19th

Fresh breezes from N E at 7 P M wind S by N
steering N middle part fresh breezes with rain
hauld reefed the topsails latter part wind
S and rain wind fresh so ends

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Sunday the 20th

Begining with strong breezes from S W and rain
steering N took in all sail but doubled
reefed main topsail and fore sail saw 2
flinbacks middle and latter part breezes from
N E ship heading N by W thick weather

Shortning sail nights
Standing back crew watches N by W

April 1845

Monday the 21st

Fresh breezes from N E ship heading
N by W at 7 P M shortened sail
for the night at daylight made sail
latter part fine breezes and cloudy ship heading
N by W employed in repairing old boats
blacksmith welding lances and doing
other necessary jobs so ends N by W

April 1845

Tuesday the 22nd

Fine breezes and cloudy with little rain
ship heading N by E middle part the same
at 6 A M doubled reefed the topsails at 7
took in jib and main sail blowing fresh with
rain at 10 took in fore and mizen topsails ship
heading N by W got an observation not very good
Lat 41° 48'
