

Ship Hibernia at Sea N P Simmons Master

April 1845

Tuesday the 29th

Fine breeze from the Eastward and thick weather
steering N by W with all sail set employed
in sundries middle part wind freshened at 5 AM
doubled reefed the topsails at 8 AM in fore and
main topsails jib and spanker sail at 9 AM
spoke the Meteorium latter part light gale

Lat 48° 32'
Long 158° 33'

April 1845

Wednesday the 30th

Fresh gale and cloudy. Capt went on board at 6
AM came on board got some sea coal
ship heading N by E under short sail
Boat crew watched middle and latter part fresh
breeze and good squalls at doubled reefed topsails
saw 7 ships Blacksmith employed in fitting the
lin chain Copper making Bury keys coiled a small
3 fathoms of line so ends

Ship Hibernia at Sea N P Simmons Master

May 1845

Thursday the 1st

Strong breeze and squally from N.E. by E
ship heading N by E under double reefed
topsails and jib at 7 AM set
whole topsails and main sail at 11 AM
set topgallant sail foggy most of the time
wind at 11 AM ship heading N by E
employed in ship's duty the Moe in
sight so ends Lat 51° 19' W
got out water

May 1845

Friday the 2nd

This day Begins with a light breeze from
N at 7 AM took ship heading E by E
thick fog at 8 PM took in the topgallant
sails and main sail middle part wind freshened
to the westward steering N by E at 3 PM
made all sail latter part foggy most of
time saw the Moe employed in doing
necessary jobs

AB Observed

May 1845

Saturday the 3rd

A light breeze from the westward and
thick fog most of the time at 9 PM
took in the topgallant sails and main sail
steering N by E middle part the same at
daylight set main topgallant sail latter part
light breeze from S and cloudy saw pinbacks
and the Meteorium so ends

Lat 52° 30'
