

Ship Hibernia at Sea N.W. Coast

June 1845

Thursday the 19th

Light breeze and thick fog at 8 P.M. cleared up
saw one seal at 6 P.M. saw land bearing
N by W distance about 40 miles no whales
in sight took ship heading S by E off shore
carried whale to water at 10 light made all sail
better part light air and good weather ship
ready to go to the westward saw plenty of pump
boats so ends employed in detaching them
Lat 54° 36' Long 157° 00'

June 1845

Friday the 20th

Light breeze and good weather at 2 P.M. saw
2 right whales bore the boat and got one
took him to the snout commenced cutting
got in his head stopped for the night at
3 P.M. commenced cutting the head at 5 finished
and commenced bailing this day ends
light air and thick fog
15° 11' 16'



June 1845

Saturday the 21st

Light breeze and good weather at 2 P.M. saw
2 right whales going quick to the wind and bore
without success snout and latter part thick
fog ship heading to the southward and
westward employed in bailing

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Sunday the 22nd

Light breeze and thick fog doubled, needed
the topsails at 8 P.M. cleared off to fine weather
at 12 midnight wore ship latter part
light air and pleasant weather finished
bailing so ends Lat 52° 20' 48' Long 157° 00'

June 1845

Monday the 23rd

Light breeze from the westward ship
heading to the northward with all
sail at 2 P.M. saw him back middle and
latter part calm employed in straining
down oil saw a seal Lat 53° 10'

June 1845

Tuesday the 24th

Commenced with a calm middle and
latter part a light breeze from the N.W. ship
heading to the northward and westward this day
saw 4 carcases and 2 ships sailing but no
whales employed in straining down oil

Lat 53° 30' Long 157° 00'
