

Ship Siberia at Sea: W. East: W. Simons

June 1845

Wednesday the 25th

Light breezes and fine weather steering W. W. 1  
finished stowing oil employed in starting Siberian  
S. S. P. came in thick fog and shortened  
sail for the night middle land latter part  
thick fog employed in setting up short racks  
so ends

June 1845

Thursday the 26

Light breezes and thick fog setting up short  
wind from the southward middle part  
fog cleared off latter part fine breezes and  
cloudy no whales to be seen wind from  
southward ship heading W. with all sail set

June 1845

Friday the 27th

Fine breezy and cloudy ship heading W. S. W. 1  
with all sail set saw plenty fish backs middle  
and latter part fresh gales and thick weather  
ship under short sail heading to the south  
so ends

June 1845

Saturday the 28th

Strong breeze and thick weather ship heading  
on different tack under short sail till  
past and upon track heading E. S. E.  
no whales in sight

S. S. Bu 45  
Long 162 1/2

June 1845

Sunday the 29th

Fresh gales and bad weather ship under  
double reefed main heading E. and  
S. E. on middle and latter part fresh breezes  
and fair ship heading S. E. W. 1 saw  
a small right whale going quick  
beyond the boat without success

June 1845

Monday the 30th

First part of the 24 hours light breezes and  
good weather saw neither bottom nor  
P. B. wind W. steering to the southward  
carrying all sail through the night latter  
part fresh breezes and fog equally saw hump  
backs but no right whales so ends
