

Ship Hibernia at Sea W Coast of S. Linnon

July 1845

Tuesday the 1st

Fresh breezes and fog squalls ship heading
S E with all sail set wind S W by S
at 8 P.M. took in the main sail & middle
and later part wind and weather the
same not a whale to be seen

Lat 55° 00' N
Long 160° 00' W

July 1845

Wednesday the 2nd

Fresh breezes and cloudy weather steering
N by E all sail set saw one fin back
standing white watches middle part wind
and weather the same at day light saw
a sail and plenty of fin backs at 8 A.M.
spoke the Armata of N London 8 whales
this season in company with her

Long 157° 45' W

July 1845

Thursday the 3rd

Fresh breezes and cloudy weather steering
N E by E saw fin backs at 8 P.M. parted
company with the A middle part of the
part light breezes and fine weather steering
to the Eastward at 9 A.M. spoke the A
no ends no obs

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July 1845

Friday the 4th

10 P.M. N London
0 whales

Fine breeze and cloudy weather in company
with the A at 5 P.M. spoke the
Baogoe Flame of N London nothing
this season since time saw 2
whales going quick to the east
longed the boat without success
at 8 P.M. shortened sail then
the night middle part thick and sailing
at 8 P.M. made sail at 8 P.M. saw
a whale covered the boat without success
at the time have one coil of four line
for one doz of 3ms and 2 coils of 100 lbs part
fine breeze steering to the north

July 1845

Saturday the 5th

Light breezes and good weather steering
N by W not a whale to be seen the
A and the A at night middle part light
air and calm latter part fresh breezes
and thick fog steering to the north
saw a pump Back

July 1845

Sunday the 6th

Fresh breezes and thick weather at
8 P.M. shortened sail ship heading N E
wind S E by E saw fin backs till day
ends with a fog and thick weather
