

Ship Hibernia at Sea N.W. Coast

July 1845

Monday the 7th
Commenced with a light gale from S.E. &
and thick weather ship lying to windward
short sail on different tacks visible and
latter part light breezes and thick fog made
sail steering to the northward so ends

July 1845
Tuesday the 8th

Thick weather and light breezes from the S.W.
ship heading on the wind heading N.W. at 4
P.M. had cleared up saw a sail at 5 P.M.
spoke the Barque Cossack of Rochester 3 whales
this season middle and latter part fine breezes
and cloudy weather bent the flying jib in company
with the Cossack ship heading S.E.
Lat 54° 05' N
Long 153° 06' W

Wednesday the 9th

Light breezes from S.E. ship heading E at
5 P.M. saw hump backs thick weather ship heading
S.W. carrying all sail whole watches middle
and latter part light breezes and fog squalls steering
S.E. with all sail set nothing in sight

Long 153° 40' W

Thursday the 10th
Light breeze from the north steering S.E.
saw one fin back at 5 P.M. spoke the
Barque Persia of St. Bedford 3 whales
this season middle part fine breezes
S.W. ship heading S.E. latter part
light breezes and foggy saw a fin back

July 1845
Friday the 11th

Light breezes and half thick saw several
hump backs ship heading S.E. with all
sail set at 5 P.M. spoke Ship Flycatcher
of Bridgeport 1 whale this season middle
part weather the same latter part calm
and rain yet so ends from the S.
so ends

July 1845
Saturday the 12th

A light breeze from N.W. ship heading
S.E. with all sail set saw plenty
fin backs at 7 P.M. shortened sail for the
night middle part fresh breezes latter
part the same middle sail steering S.E.
at 9 P.M. saw a whale going quite fair
back without success so ends
Lat 54° 08' N
Long 153° 54' W

saw several whale
