July 1845

Sunday the 13th

Light breeze from the westward and good weather
saw several whales lowered for them without
success very well saw 2 ships at 7 P.M. shortened
sail for the night middle part fine weather
at day 6 P.M. made sail and saw 2 whales
lowered the boats could not get near them
this day ends with good weather saw
one ship

Long 153° 30'

July 1845

Monday the 14th

Fine breeze and good weather saw some fin
backs 3 ships in sight one boiling at 6
P.M. spoke the Romor of St. Paul
5 whales this season shortened sail
for the night middle part fresh breeze
and thick weather later part a light gale
ship under short sail heading on different
ticks

Tuesday the 15th

A light gale from the westward ship
heading to the southward at 5 P.M. shortening
sail fin backs middle and later part
fine breeze and good weather this day saw
whales 3 times going very quick N.W.
lowered the boats once without success
saw a ship cutting

Wednesday the 16th

Light breeze from the southward steering
E at 7 P.M. shortened sail middle
and later part thick fog ship lying
with her main yard aback

Thursday the 17th

Light breeze and thick weather at
4 P.M. cleared up saw whales lowered
the had a chance to partened came
in thick went on board and saw
sail middle and later part thick
weather saw a rather whale

July 1845

Friday the 18th

Fresh breeze and thick weather ship heading
on different ticks at 6 P.M. shortened
sail middle and later a gale and thick
weather saw one whale
