

Ship Hibernia at Sea N.W. Coast N.P. Simmons

July 1845

Saturday the 19th
at light breeze from the westward ship
heaving in different tacks under sheet
sail at daylight not doubled reefed topmasts
moderated at 5 P.M. lowered the boats for a whale
fastened at noon had him turned up whales
round it had took all the lines (saved them)



July 1845

Sunday the 20th

Light breezes and good weather got the whale to the ship
at 1 P.M. at 2 commenced cutting and cut until
night at 4 P.M. commenced cutting again at
7 finished at 10 lowered for a whale without
success so ends employed in boiling

July 1845

Monday the 21st

Light breezes and thick weather ship heaving in
different tacks at 1 P.M. shortened sail middle
part thick weather latter part the same all
but about one hour saw 3 whales so ends
employed in boiling

July 1845

Tuesday the 22nd
Fresh breezes and thick weather ship heaving
in different tacks under sheet sail latter
part the same the fog less up by spots see whales
employed in boiling and slowly down

July 1845

Wednesday the 23rd

Fresh breezes from W and thick fog squalls saw plenty
whales lowered boats once came on board again on
the account of fog saw one ship middle and
latter part fresh breezes and cloudy weather
at 10 P.M. lowered for a whale without
success at 11 P.M. finished boiling
so ends

July 1845

Thursday the 24th

Fresh breezes and rough at 1 P.M. heaved
the boat and fastened to a whale the Iron
hook at 3 P.M. lowered for a whale without
success came on board and shortened sail
middle part strong breezes at daylight
made sail saw a Barque whaling
at 7 P.M. lowered for a whale came on
thick fog soon after came on board and
went to skimming down oil so ends
