

Ship Hibernia at Sea W^N Coast N^P Limmer Mⁿ

August 1845

Friday the 1st
Light breezes and fine weather employed in
repairing the main topsail nothing in sight
middle and latter part strong breezes steering W^N by W
wind I finished the main topsail and with
thick weather

August
Saturday the 2nd

Good breezes and rainy saw plenty fin backs
middle and latter part strong breezes and rough
clouded reefed the topsails saw plenty of
sea & other bottoms
Lat 53° 46'
Long 13° 40' 06"

August 1845

Sunday the 3rd

Strong breezes and clear weather middle part
moderated wind W^N ship heading E^N by E
made all sail latter part the same
saw fin backs hump backs saw a cark's
no ends Lat 54° 50'

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Monday the 4th

Commenced fresh breezes from W^N and
thick weather doubled reefed the topsail
at 5 P.M. took in the fore and main
topsails and main sail at 6 P.M.
Clear reefed the main topsail ship heading
N^W by E blowing a light gale middle part
moderated at daylight made sail
ship heading N^W by E shifted the fore
topsail latter part fine breezes and a head
saw nothing in sight Lat 55° 22'
Long 13° 30'

August 1845

Tuesday the 5th

Fresh breezes from W^N and a
heavy swell from W^N by E ship heading
N^W by E saw one fin back middle
part calm latter part strong breezes saw
a ship whaling at 8 P.M. saw a whale
lowered the boat came on ruggel came
on board ship under doubled reefed
topsail on different tack

August 1845

Wednesday the 6th

Fresh breezes and clear weather saw
whales to the windward at 6 P.M.
saw the Doctor of W^N Bedford 11 whales
11000 lbs took in sail for the night middle
part moderated to fine weather at daylight saw
nothing latter part strong breezes and rough
at 10 A.M. lowered the boat for sperm whales
fastened to one soon after came on board
saw eight whales
Lat 56° 14'
Long 13° 20' 22"
