

Ship *Hibernia* at Sea N.W. Coast of Labrador

August 1845

Tuesday the 19th

Light breeze and good weather the whales
seen had the Irons down from the coar. and the
line got foul of the cable and got out with four
Iron came on board at 1 P.M. came in thick
fog took in the light sail steering E.N.E.
middle part and latter part misty but
thick showed of the starboard sail at 1 P.M.
the after-hall so ends steering N.W. & E.

August 1845

Wednesday the 20th

Light breeze and thick weather put the remains
of our oil between decks at 7 P.M. shortened
sail for the night middle and latter part light
air and thick weather employed in scraping
saw and setting up boards so ends

Lat 53° 21'

August 1845

Thursday the 21st

Light breeze and calm at 1 P.M. fog cleared
up saw a sail and several whales heard
the ship at 2 fastened the whale ran back to
the windward at 6 P.M. had him turned up
and commenced towing came in thick
fogged the whale and started for the ship
heard her gun at 8 P.M. got in board and
shortened sail middle part stood on different
tacks latter part foggy saw nothing of the whale saw
plenty of ice over lowered the boat once

Ship *Hibernia* at Sea N.W. Coast

August 1845

Friday the 22nd

Light breeze and fog saw plenty
whales lowered the boat without success
to much fog ship under whole topails
middle part the same sky heading on
different tacks at 7 & 8 P.M. saw a light
breeze from S.W. made all sail saw a whale
at 8 P.M. lowered the boat without success
saw a carcass steering ship N.W. & E.

August 1845

Saturday the 23rd

Fresh breeze and good weather saw
several whales lowered without success
the water boat got stove heaving her up
took her in shortened sail for the
night saw a sail to the leeward middle
and latter part fresh breeze saw plenty of whales
lowered the boat fastened to one Iron down
saw the ship Vineyard of Edgartown 11 whales
saw her boat fast to one some time but
did not get him so ends

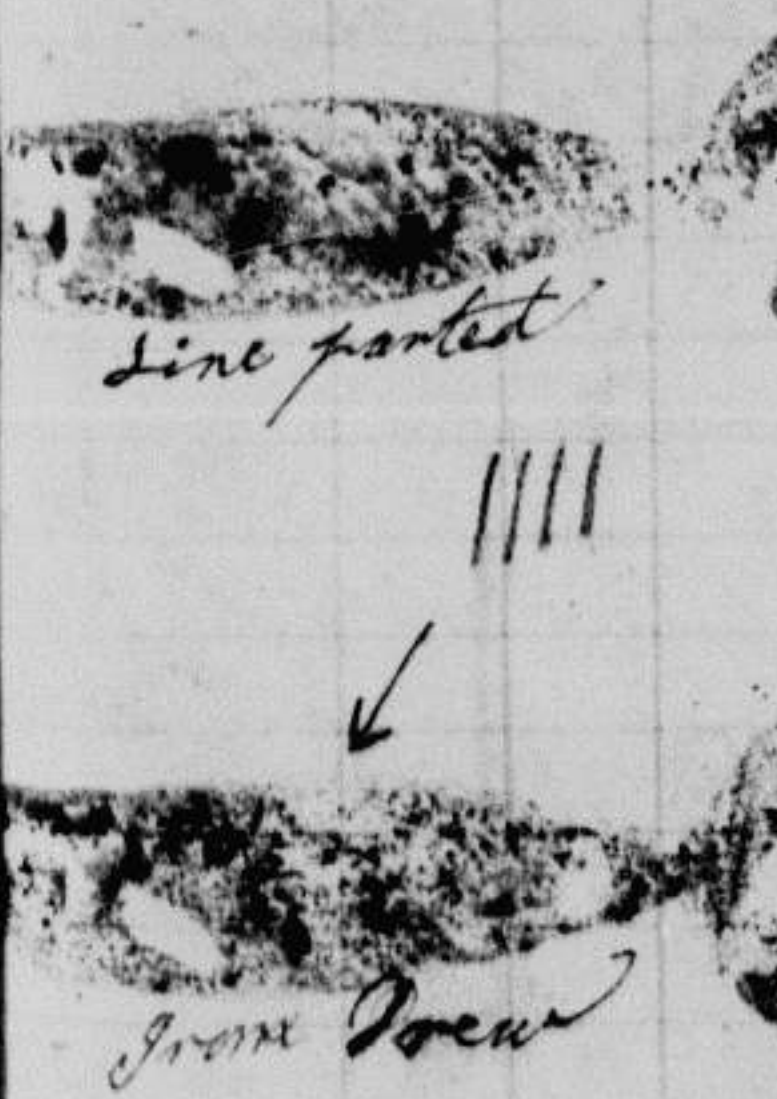
From down

August 1845

Sunday the 24th

Light breeze from the westward, and good
weather saw plenty whales got out a new
boat lowered for whales got on to one whale
and got stove but did not fastened took
her to the ship and went to repairing her all
boats stove but 2 and one of them boats
had chased more whales without success middle
part light air at daylight lowered for a whale
without success at 8 P.M. got the boat down toward
3 boats one boat fastened line parted on another boat
fastened and down the 3 boat fastened line
parted fastened again to the same whale
