

Ship Hibernia at Sea NW Coast of Simmons M.

August 1845

Monday the 25th

Light airs and fine weather at 2 P.M. got the whale
along side at 3 commenced cutting at 8 finished
clear up decks and commenced hauling midline
part calm latter light breezes and fine weather at daylight
saw whales hauled one boat fastened the line parted came
on board could not haul without success



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August 1845

Tuesday the 26th

Light breezes and fine ship on different parts saw plenty whales
lowered the boat without success at 6 P.M. fastened again
the whale sunk heavy haled him up and got
him to the ship at 7 P.M. commenced cutting at
12 meridian finished light breezes and good
weather saw whales so ends

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August 1845

Wednesday the 27th

Light breezes and good weather plenty whales in
sight lowered boats without success at 7 P.M. shortened
sail middle part light airs latter part calm all
hands employed in boiling and setting up sheets
uncovered for whales without success one sail in
sight hailing

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Ship Hibernia at Sea NW Coast

August 1845

Thursday the 28th

Light airs and calms and plenty of whales
fastened to one and drew middle part the same
latter part light breezes made sail saw
2 whales lowered fastened to one slightly
saw one as only employed in boiling
and cooping pipes

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August 1845

Friday the 29th

Light breezes and rough saw a whale
lowered the boat without success came on
board and took in sail and stowed down
some oil middle part and latter part light
airs and calms all hands employed in cooping
oil to stow so ends land in sight
Lat 55° 08'

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August

Saturday the 30th

Light breezes ship heading off shore saw
whales lowered the boat and fastened Iron Dred
came on board and stowed down oil between
sheets at 11 P.M. finished boiling at 2 P.M.
breezed on with rain shortened sail ship
heading E & E latter part strong breezes
saw one sail Lat 54° 48'

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
