

Ship Hibernia at Sea Brought to the Sandwich Is.
Nathan P. Simmons M.D.

September 1845

Monday the 22th
Fresh breezes from S.W. ship heading S.E.
with all sail set at 4 P.M. wind W.S.W.
steering S.E. at 7 P.M. squally hard in fore
and main. A gallant sail. Middle part fresh
breezes after part strong wind hauled to S. single
reefed the topmast 20 ends Lat 42° 05'

September 1845

Tuesday the 23th

Strong breezes from S ship heading E by S
jib sheet partly made new ones, taken in
the main sail spanker and double reefed
the topmast at 7 P.M. blowing a gale here
to under sheet reefed main topmast at 12
midnight moderated made some sail latter
part a light gale from the South ship heading
S.E. bent a new fore sail the old split
take in the fore topmast and main sail
Lat 46° 32'
Long 144° 14'

September 1845

Wednesday the 24th

Light gales wind hauling to the weather
and moderating a little at fore topmast and
main sail ship heading S.E. by S middle part
more moderate set up fore and main
topmast at 7 P.M. sheet and the reef of the
main topmast the sail split sent it down, coil
away the main topmast sail sent it down
and bent a new fore sail. Latter part fresh breezes
and squally
Lat 44° 00'
Long 143° 22'

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Thursday the 25th

Fresh breezes and squally from W steering
S bent a new fore topmast sheeting sail bent
out for a water seat and altered E
middle part fresh breezes from S.W. ship
heading S.E. latter part strong breezes
employed in repairing the main topmast

Lat 42° 44'

Even in yesterday Long 143° 42'

September 1845

Friday the 26th

Strong breezes from S.W. ship heading
S.E. finished the new fore topmast and
bent it at 7 P.M. ship heading S.E.
middle and latter part fresh breezes from
S.W. bent a new main sail

Lat 40° 46'

Long by Chron 141° 31'

Long by Lunar 141° 55'

September 1845

Saturday the 27th

Fine breezes and pleasant weather ship heading
S.E. by S middle and latter part light breezes
and good weather ship heading S.E. employed
in repairing the flying jib and other necessary work

Long 141° 00'
