

Ship Hibernia at Sea Bound to the Sandwich Isles

October 1845

Saturday the 4th

Light breezes from the westward and good weather staved away our boat and new sparker middle and latter part light breezes and good weather this day took up the sheathing of deck so ends Lat 30° 25' Long 148° 45'

October 1845

Sunday the 5th

Fresh breezes from the Eastward steering S by W back fine to gale and fresh partial middle part heading S by E latter the same Lat 28° 39'

at 9 AM Log 150° 50' by Chron
at 2 PM Log 150° 50' by Lunar

October 1845

Monday the 6th

Fresh breezes from S E and squally with rain ship heading S by W middle part fresh squalls relieved the trade at 6 PM good weather made all sail latter part light breezes from the Eastward ship heading S by W employed in scraping the deck Lat 27° 02'

October 1845

Tuesday the 7th

Light breezes from E steering S by W set staking sail employed in working ship middle and latter part fine breezes bent a new fore top sail so ends Lat 25° 24' Long 152° 50'

October 1845

Wednesday the 8th

Fresh breezes and cloudy weather steering S by W wind E employed in making sprunsum and other necessary work middle and latter part fine breezes and good weather scraping lower mast Lat 23° 11' Long 154° 05'

October the 9th

Thursday the 9th

Fine breezes and good weather steering S by W and S by W varnished the masts employed in setting down rigging and other necessary work middle and latter part fine breezes and good weather

Lat 22° 11'
Long 155° 01'
