

Ship Hibernia at Sea Board to the S. Is.

October 1845

Friday the 10th

Fine breezes from E and good weather saw land bearing S W by N steering N S by W at dark took in the studding sail and top gallant sails middle part light breezes at day light made all sail got the anchors ready and bent the cables saw several sail some round in and some out latter part light breezes from N E steering in for Moore

October 1845

Saturday the 11th

Light breezes and good weather at 2 P.M. the Captain went on shore at 2 P.M. took a fresh breeze from the southward about took in the top gallant sails at 4 P.M. the boat came on board landed the Capt to proceed to the train employed in fitting the ship up middle and latter part fresh breezes from the southward at 12 meridian came to an anchor in 25 fathoms 39 ships in sent a boat ashore

October 1845

Sunday Saturday the 12th Sunday

Fresh breezes from the southward and suggested some ships got underway thinking it going to blow but the wind is going down middle part wind freshened at 3 P.M. fresh squalls the ship dragged a little yine the mine chain several ships dragged and some went out latter part the same

October 1845

Monday the 13th

Light breezes and thick rainy weather at 8 P.M. cleared up good weather some ships came in again middle and latter part the same got one boat from the Joseph Meigs ^{of Hull} and one from the Armato ^{of Hull} L sent so ends Lying at anchor 80 fathoms of chain

October 1845

Tuesday the 14th

Light breezes and good weather got off our bread at 6 P.M. got under weigh for Wahoo to repair damages at 9 P.M. the Capt came on board and Mr Smith's Messenger as passenger for Wahoo middle and latter part light breezes from the westward and good weather employed in keeping and washing ship several ships working up for Wahoo so ends

October 1845

Wednesday the 15th

Light breezes from the westward and good weather ship on different tasks between Moritz and Rarri middle part a breeze from N E set studding sails steering for Wahoo latter part fine breezes at 1 P.M. 11 boats came to an anchor at the harbor at Wahoo the Capt and passengers and boat crew went ashore
