

Ship Hibernia at the Sandwich Islands

October 1845

Thursday the 16th

Fish breeze and good weather. Being at anchor with the whole of the labboard chain out at 6 P.M. boat came on board middle part masted at 6 P.M. hove up anchor and went in further in 9 fathoms water. Several ships came in and several went out. The St. Louis' watch came ashore this day discharged 3d officer Mr Benjamin Wilcox

October 1845

Friday the 17th

Light breeze and good weather. Watch employed in breaking out 2 hogs and setting up for water at 7 P.M. watch came on board middle part calm at 8 P.M. the pilot came on board and took us in the encampment and moored her. The carpenter came on board to see about repairing the ship. L. watch went ashore

October 1845

Saturday the 18th civil account

Fine weather employed in setting up pipe shades for water at 8 P.M. watch came on board at 8 P.M. watch came on board so each took some each ass.

October 1845

Sunday the 19th

This day some rain. Several some of the ships company went ashore to church some ships came in the outer harbor

October 1845

Monday the 20th

Fri day broke out our meal found 17 pints 6 high stored down some oil from between decks. L. watch went ashore sent some coals a shoe for water 2 carpenters on board to work watch came on board

October 1845

Tuesday the 21st

This day had over board on board the blisters for 24 pints 20,484 lbs L. watch shore finished setting pipes. This day each well watch came on board
