

Ship Hibernia at Sea N. B. Linman M^r

November 1845

Sunday the 16th

Strong trade and good weather set fore and
main topgallant sail middle and latter part the
same so ends Lat 34° 02'
Ship took 150 stowage for hour forward, scupper her
stem and starboard lower ship pitching heavy

November 1845

Monday the 17th

Fresh trades and squally made all sail set
topmast & studen sail middle part fine weather
latter part squally with rain from S. E. & took in
the light sails so ends is it

November 1845

Tuesday the 18th

Fresh breezes from S. took ship heading to the
Eastward all sail set at 4 P.M. calm middle part
the same at 3 A.M. a fresh breeze from S. E. took
in topgallant sails fore & main & set latter
part a light air from S. W. ship heading S. E. finished
the main topmast

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Wednesday the 19th

Light airs and calms sent the mizen top
sail to repair at 4 P.M. a light breeze
from the Eastward ship heading S. E. the
Southward middle and latter part fine weather
ship heading S. E. so ends Lat 34° 04'
Ship took very little in good weather Long 157° 30'
saw some sort of whales to the windward

November 1845

Thursday the 20th

Fresh breezes from S. E. ship heading S. E.
& employed in repairing mizen topmast
middle part squally took in the light sails
latter part strong breezes and good weather
finishing job was parted commenced it made a
new one Lat 34° 03'
157° 32'

November 1845

Friday the 21st

Fresh breezes from S. E. ship heading S. E.
employed in repairing mizen topmast at 4 P.M.
squally with rain middle part calm latter part
light breezes and good weather ship heading S. E.
finished the mizen topmast and beat it
Lat 34° 03'
