

Ship Hibernia at Sea N° P. Hemmings New
February 1846

Wednesday the 4th

Commences with a gale from N.W. steering E by S under
double reefed fore and main topail and fore sail middle
part masted, at 5 P.M. much all sail set steering
sail fore and main topail reefed at latter part light breeze
from the North and foggy so ends

Lat 52° 45'
Long 13° 30'

February 1846

Thursday the 5th

Light breeze from N and thick weather bent
the new fore sail and main sail repaired the
fore and main topail and bent it steering E middle
part fore and main topail reefed under the top sail
middle part fore and main topail reefed under the top sail
middle part fore and main topail reefed under the top sail

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Friday the 6th

Light breeze from N.W. and thick weather steering
E all sail set middle and latter part the same
stove up an old boat put the waste board over
head

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Saturday the 7th

Light breeze and thick weather steering
the fore topail reefed under main sail
middle part the weather better part the
same

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Sunday the 8th

Light breeze from N.W. and cloudy weather
at 4 P.M. spoke the Parque, Jane Francis
of London 24 days from Hobart Town and
to London went on board got papers middle and
latter part light breeze and thick weather
the day caught 3 porpoises

February 1846

Monday the 9th

Light breeze from N.W. and cloudy weather
steering E by N middle and latter part
light breeze and good weather employed in repairing
the ship so ends
