

Ship Hibernia at Sea

February 1846

Saturday the 28th

Light breeze from the South and good weather
at 9 o'clock a boat came on board said no whales
seen stating said steering N.W. & saw a sail
standing to the eastward middle wind light from N.W.
to N. the part the same light the main top
gallant sail some men climbing so on

Ship Hibernia

March 1846

Sunday the 1st

Light breeze and calm and fine weather saw
several fin backs middle part calm latter part
a light breeze from N.W. & steering N.W.
not standing sail so on

March 1846

Monday the 2nd

Light breeze from N.W. steering N.W. & E
with all sail set at 6 o'clock saw ice and standing
to the westward no sail forward but fore sail middle
part fresh breeze at 3 o'clock wind hauled to N.W.
and strong not standing sail steering N.

Long 54. 45

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March 1846

Tuesday the 3rd

Strong breeze from S.W. steering N.W. & W
middle part the same latter part moderated
we began steering home crew came off with
get out most fine weather

Lat 44. 39

Long 54. 14

March 1846

Wednesday the 4th

Fine breeze and good weather steering
N.W. & W. water employed in repairing topgallant
and finished at about 10 o'clock part
fresh breeze latter part strong from N.W.
ship heading N.W. & E. doubled reefed the topgallant
saw a sail steering N.E.

Long 54. 20

March 1846

Thursday the 5th

Strong breeze from N.W. ship heading N.W. & E
got all water middle and latter part a gale
ship heading N.W. & W. under double reef
main topgallant and fore sail
