Friday the 6th
Fresh breeze from N.W. and single reefed
top-sails, jib and main sail at 8 P.M. moderate
made all sail saw a ship ahead later part light
breeze and good weather

March 1846
Saturday the 7th

Portland Light-house
21 miles to
1400 ft. h.
120 ft. of glass

Light airs from the westward ship heading
to the North at 1 P.M. spoke the *Boothland*
of Sag Harbor 21 miles 1450 lbs 120 ft. of glass
middle part light breeze and hazy later part
fresh and squally ship on different tacks
no wind

March 1846
Sunday the 8th

Fresh breeze and squally at 3 P.M.
wind shifted to W. checked reefed the
top-sails steering N.W. middle part
strong breeze later part light no wind
Lat 39.36
Long 82.00

Monday the 9th
Light breeze from S and good weather starting
at 11 A.M. at 3 P.M. saw a sail standing
to the S.E. at 6 P.M. covered down the *Shelburne*
last 10 go on board a ship nearly calm middle
part calm at 8 P.M. boat came on board did not
go to the ship at 9 P.M. spoke the *Elizabeth*
Starbuck of Portland 2 m 10 days and 30 fms
later part light breeze and fine weather
Lat 39.40
Long 82.31

March 1846
Tuesday the 10th

Light breeze and fine weather ship on
different tacks middle part the same later
part light breeze from N.W. and fine weather ship
heading N.E. watch employed in ship's duty

March 1846
Wednesday the 11th

Light breeze from N.W. ship heading N.E.
got out meat middle part the same saw a
ship steering to the westward later part fine
weather and light breeze from N.W. ship heading
N.W.
