

Ship Hibernia at Sea Coast of Brazil

March 1846

Tuesday the 24th

Fine breeze from S & ship heading W in shore middle part got a fresh breeze from S & W. Weather S & E. equally and ship's lightening all round. Little fine breeze from S & W. and good weather employed in putting rigging and in sight sick man better.

at 2 PM

March 1846

Wednesday the 25th

Fine breeze from S and good weather steering S & E. Little middle part, calm latter part wind W & ship on different tacks working in shore for St Catherine. At night variable the most

March 1846

Thursday the 26th

Light breeze from E & S. ship heading W. In shore middle part made in the light sails going off and on wind backing at 12 midnight a strong breeze from S going off and on at daylight saw St Catherine bearing W steering W made sail at 10 AM got of the entrance steering in for the harbor W & S. Tackled once so ends

Ship Hibernia at St Catherine

March 1846

Friday the 27th

Fresh breeze from the southward steering in the harbor at 2 PM came to anchor in 6 fathoms water a Sardinian man of war and the French ship of St Raphael and an English schooner in the harbor got the Doctor of the ship of St Raphael to come on board and look at our sick man got 40 lbs cash as per for water middle and latter part good weather at 7 AM got off again water S & W. went ashore the Capt went to the town to enter ship so ends

Saturday the 28th

Light breeze from Eastward water employed in hauling sail and scraping the hulls the Doctor visited the ship at 6 PM water came on board middle part fine weather latter part the same. A watch went ashore so ends

March 1846

Sunday the 29th

Fine weather water employed in painting ship and wetting hull at 6 PM water came on board all that carpenter and join the one that we shipped at St Catherine middle part rain with a heavy tempest latter part fine weather
