

Ship Hibernia at St Catharines

c March 1846

Monday the 30th

Fine weather and pleasant breeze from all quarters
middle part the same latter part calm and
rain employed in heaving coil to trim ship
and some coal fired for reboats our sick men
getting better the Doctor visited the ship every day
so ends

c April

March 1846

Tuesday the 31st

Light air and falling some rain finished stowing
coil coal bread for again middle part
rain and squalls this day stowed stow our
water tubs Mount Vernon went to sea
the Rio stamer came on
the Doctor pronounced our sick men well enough
to go to sea

Wednesday 1st April 1846

Fresh breeze from the southward middle part
the same latter part fine weather saild
276 gal of oil the John Wells of the work came
on so ends

c April 1846

Thursday the 2nd

Light breeze from the South and good
weather got 5000 of oranges at 2 P.M.
have sheep loaded the sails at 4 P.M.
the sail came on board got under way
shipped 2 men to await their passage home
middle part light breeze from E S E got and
clear from the land ahead the anchors and
cables latter part light air from E S E ship
heading W along with the land
Lat 26.44

c April 1846

Friday the 3rd

Light breeze from the Eastward ship heading
W and at 11 P.M. land in sight distance 10 miles
middle part the same at 12 midnight tacked ship
heading S E latter part fresh breeze from E S E
ship heading S E and a breeze steering S W
water employed in filling rigging
Lat 26.45
