c April 1846

Saturday the 4th

Four breezes from N.E. ship heading E.S.E. all
sail set middle part wind hauled down E.
latter part N.W. steering N.E. exchanged
signals with a French Barge watch employed
in fishing rigging

Long 48° 30'

c April 1846

Sunday the 5th

Light breeze from N.W. steering N.E. set steady sails
middle part, wind hauled to N.W. latter
part S. and fresh steering N.E. & E.

Lat 26° 28'

c April 1846

Monday the 6th

Four breezes from S. steering N.E. & E. all
sail set middle and latter part fresh from
S.E. steering the same watch employed
in fishing rigging

Lat 24° 31'

Ship Hibernia at Sea East of Brazil

c April 1846

Tuesday the 7th

Light breeze from S.E. and good weather
steering N.E. saw Black Lk. middle
part the same at 3 P.M. all wind hauled
down E. at 10 P.M. tacked ship heading E.S.E.
saw a sail and land bearing N. distant
40 miles. 20 miles

Lat 23° 35'

c April 1846

Wednesday the 8th

Light breeze from E. tacked ship heading
N.W. at 4 P.M. all sails set and wind
at 10 P.M. tacked ship heading of shore at
3 P.M. tacked in shore at 1 P.M. tacked
off shore wind E. ship heading S.E.

Lat 23° 24'

c April 1846

Thursday the 9th

Five breezes from N.E. ship heading E.S.E.
Land in sight bearing N. distant 30 miles
saw a sail to the leeward watch employed
in fishing rigging middle and latter part
strong breezes from N.E. ship heading
S.E. & E. took in the topgallensail and fly
jib
