

Remarks on board Ship. *Nilemia* of New Bedford

Wednesday August 17th Commenced with strong breezes and thick weather ship laying off and on at Fayall the *Brig Lacitia* laying off and on at 3 o'clock the Barge came off and we sent seven casks of oil ashore to be sent home at 5 o'clock some Prunes Watermelons fruit cabbage and O came off we unloaded the boat and sent her ashore the capt came off and we hauled forward and stood for the East and off St George at 8 P.M. the Boat went ashore at St George but did not get anything so they came on board we then squared the yards and stood to the Southward watches engaged in various duties saw one sunfish

Thursday August 18th Pleasant with a fine breeze from the Westward steering Sth by West as a course with all sail set watches engaged in various duties nothing seen middle pleasant latter part pleasant with a fine breeze from the Westward steering to the Southward saw a Brig steering East watches engaged in filling the studding sails and gear

Friday August 19th Pleasant with a fine breeze from the Westward steering South nothing seen watches engaged in various duties middle and latter part pleasant with a fine breeze from the Westward ship heading to the Southward under all sail nothing seen watches engaged in making snuff and spungers

Saturday August 20th Pleasant with a fine breeze from the Westward heading to the Southward watches engaged in various duties latter part pleasant with light breeze from the Westward steering South watches engaged in making spungers and snuff

Running out Master North Atlantic bound to the Cape de Verde

Sunday August 21st Commenced with light air and pleasant weather steering Sth by West saw a Brig bound to the Southward and Westward also saw Grampuses at 6 o'clock squared the yards and set the studding sails middle and latter part pleasant with the wind from the Northward steering Sth by West saw three sails steering to the Sth West

Monday August 22nd Pleasant with a fine breeze from the N East steering Sth by West 1/2 West with studding sails below and aloft saw 4 sails steering to the S nothing seen in the shape of Whales

Middle and latter part pleasant with a fine breeze from the N East steering Sth by West studding sails below and aloft saw three or four sails steering to the Sth West watches engaged in various duties

Tuesday August 23rd Pleasant with a fine breeze from the N East ship under all sail steering to Southward nothing seen latter part pleasant with strong trade steering Sth by West watches engaged in various duties took out for Sugar and coffee Lat 24° 39' N Long 25° 31' West

Wednesday August 24th Pleasant with strong trade steering Sth by West At 2 o'clock spied a ship steering to the S West watches engaged in making snuff latter part pleasant with strong trade steering Sth by West saw two sails watches engaged in various duties

Thursday August 25th Pleasant with a fine breeze from the N East steering Sth by West under all sail saw a Brig steering to the Northward latter part pleasant with a fine breeze from the N East steering to the Southward saw two sails and plenty of porpoises one Blackfish caught this ship took Lat 18° 29' N Long 23° 05'
