

Remarks on board Ship Hibernia of New

Thursday Sept 8th Commences with squally weather and strong breezes from the Southward watches engaged in various duties saw two sails standing to the Northward latter part pleasant with light air from the S West ship heading to the Southward at 11 P.M. during the forenoon boat and went on board of the Ship Wm Penn of Belfast. Ireland after some papers at 12 noon I came back and Capt Hunningwell went on board there.

Friday Sept 9th Squally with thunder and plenty of rain at 4 A.M. the Capt came on board and we made sail and stood along on our course Sth by West latter part calm the Wm Penn close to us at 8 P.M. the Capt went on board there and their Mate came on board of us and spent the day Lat 12.09 N Long 21.11 W

Saturday Sept 10th Pleasant with light air and calms at 3 A.M. the Capt came on board and we stood along on our course Sth latter part pleasant with light air and calms five sail in sight Lat 16.22 N Long

Sunday Sept 11th Commences with light air saw eight vessels standing on various courses watches engaged in various duties latter part pleasant with calms saw nine sails Lat 19.23 N Long 23. West

Bedford Hunningwell Master bound South 1833

Monday Sept 12th Commences with light air from the S W ship heading to the Sth East at 2 1/2 A.M. the Ship Tigie of New Bedford run down and spoke us she was 87 days from Calcutta bound to Boston latter part rain showers with light air and calms saw several sails steering different courses No Cls

Tuesday Sept 13th Calms light air and rain showers watches engaged in making scrubbloom with nothing seen but sails latter part weather the same wind from various quarters saw three sails all standing to the Southward at 10 A.M. the Starboard fly jill guy parted sent it in and fitted another and put it out there then set the fly jill again at noon thick No Cls

Wednesday Sept 14th Thick nasty weather wind from the S W strong at sunset took in the light sails ship heading Sth latter part pleasant with a fine breeze from the S W ship heading S.E. saw two sails standing to the Southward watches engaged in various duties Lat 7.40 N Long 26.11 W

Thursday Sept 15th Pleasant with light breezes from the S W ship heading Sth East saw two sail standing to the Southward also a whale breach five times but see no more of him latter part pleasant with light air from the S W ship heading to the Southward and Eastward saw three sails standing to the South Lat 6.31 N Long 28.51 West
