

Remarks on board Ship *Hibernia* of New Bedford

Saturday October 22nd Light variable winds with rain all
hours engaged in cooping oil and
stowing down between decks at sunset
cleared up for the night and got supper
set the watch for the main middle and
latter part pleasant with variable wind ship
heading various ways saw a sail one point
on the starboard bow all hands engaged in
beaking out and stowing oil between decks
Lat 32.49 Sth Long 49.28 West

Sunday October 23rd Commences with squally weather and
a fine breeze from the N E at 4 A M
kept the Ship S W and squared the yards
finished stowing the oil and washed off deck
then got supper and set the topgallant sail
and furled the mainsail then set the
watch boats crews for the night gave the
Steward his three meals and left a pot
of water with him to drink during the
night at 11 A M the Steward shut
in the run Mr Lewis called me and I had
it cleared up latter part pleasant with
light airs from various quarters saw plenty
of humpbacks Lat 33.50 Sth Long 50.33

Monday October 24th Pleasant with light variable airs and calm
saw Porpoises course S W by N latter
Part pleasant with a strong breeze
from the S W ship on the wing
to the Westward
Lat Long 51.31 West

Tuesday October 25th Pleasant with a fine breeze from
the S W at 1 A M tacked ship
and headed to the N E east saw
sails steering to the Eastward
gave the Steward something to eat
four times today middle cabin latter
Pleasant with fine breeze at 6 P M tacked
and stood to the Southward saw a sail
and caught a Porpoise watches engaged
in stowing between decks Lat 35.25 Sth

Wednesday October 26th Pleasant with a fine breeze from the S W
ship heading to the Southward and Eastward on
the wind watches engaged in beaking out and
clearing between decks at 7 A M tacked ship
and headed in to the Westward then gave
the Steward his supper and set the topgallant
sails and fly jill middle part calm latter part
pleasant with a strong breeze from the S W
ship heading on the wind on different tacks
saw humpbacks at 5 P M sent down the
sparker and made it smaller watches
engaged in mending the sparker and
Mr Sheffield repairing the lubbered Board
Lat 36.24 Sth Long by Chron 51.45 W
by Line 51.55 West

Thursday October 27th Pleasant with light breezes from
the S W ship on the wing heading
to the Westward at 7 A M beat the
sparker middle and latter part calm watches
engaged in beaking out to see how much water
we had found 75 Bbls on the starboard side
Lat 36.51 Long

Friday October 28th Pleasant with a fine breeze from the N W
steering S W by Sth gave the Steward his meals
as usual middle and latter pleasant with
a fine breeze from the Nth steering S W
by Sth watches engaged in various duties
saw humpbacks Lat 38.55 Sth Long 54.29 West

Saturday October 29th Pleasant with a fine breeze from the
Nth at 7 A M kept the Ship S W by N
and squared the yards middle and latter
part pleasant with a fine breeze from the
Westward saw Humpbacks
Lat 40.59 Sth Long 55.25 West
