

Remarks on board Ship Libinia of New Bedford
Sunday October 30th Pleasant with a fine breeze from
the Westward ship heading Sth at 2 P.M.
took in the topgallant sails and double
up the topsail at 4 P.M. took in
the mainsail and foresail and yet
still continue to give the Steward the
same to eat that we have and some
times a little more the weather cold
middle and latter part a light gale from
the S.W. Ship on the wire heading
West Lat 42° 14' Sth Long 55° 15' W.

Monday October 31st Pleasant and more moderate at
6 A.M. set the courses and jib
middle quite moderate nothing seen
the Stewards wrists a little sore but
we don't think it safe to take them
Irons off as there are several of us
that don't think he can be trusted
middle and latter part pleasant with light
breezes from the Westward course S.W.
saw Humphbacks and finbacks watches
engaged in various duties Lat

Tuesday November 1st Pleasant with a fine breeze from the
Westward course Sth by West saw Humph
backs engaged in setting up sheets
latter part pleasant with light air and
calm saw plenty of Humphbacks

Wednesday November 2nd Pleasant with light breezes from
various quarters steering various courses
saw Humphbacks and grampuses watches
engaged in various duties passed an
English Man of War steering
to the Northward gave the Steward
his three meals at sunset took
in sail latter part pleasant

Broken out Water
233 fathoms
Water

Thursday November 3rd Commences with pleasant weather and a fine
breeze from the Eastward steering various courses
for to find a sperm whale saw plenty of
other whales but no sperm at sunset took
in sail and set the watch for the night
middle and latter part pleasant with a
fine breeze from the N.W. ship heading
to the Westward saw grampuses mending
the mainsail and mizen topgallant sail
Lat 46° 06' Sth

Friday November 4th Pleasant with a fine breeze from
the N.W. ship heading to the Westward
middle and latter part pleasant steering
various courses saw Humphbacks
Lat 46° 06' Long

Saturday November 5th Pleasant with a fine breeze from
the Westward hove out for shops for
the men steering various courses watches
engaged in various duties saw Humphbacks
Lat 45° 45' Sth

Sunday November 6th Pleasant with a fine breeze from
the Westward steering Sth by Sth
at sunset took in sail the Steward
the same as usual has bread meat
and Water down then all the time
middle and latter part pleasant with light air
from various quarters steering different courses
nothing seen

Monday November 7th Pleasant with a fine breeze from the Nth
steering E by Nth had the Steward on deck
changed his clothes took his Irons off and put
a small chain around him and fastened
him in the run again washed his wrists
and dried them gave him his supper
middle and latter part pleasant with
strong breezes from the Westward
Lat 46° 52' Sth
