

Remarks On board Ship *Hibernia*

Thursday Nov 17th Commences with thick foggy weather steering various courses nothing seen middle and latter part pleasant with a fine breeze from the S W which heading various ways saw a ship supposed to be the *Troop* Lat 45.57 N

Friday Nov 18th Pleasant with a fine breeze from the S W ship heading to the South saw a sail and pinbacks middle and latter part pleasant with a fine breeze from the Westward steering various courses saw a sail steering for us with fore topmast standing sail set Lat 46.15 N

Saturday Nov 19th Pleasant with a fine breeze at 1 A M the *Gov. Troop* ran across our stern and spoke us at 4 A M she hauled aback and Capt Miller came on board and spent the evening watches engaged in mending the courses at 7 A M bent them latter part strong breezes from the Westward ship heading to the S W on the wind nothing seen Lat 47.04 N

Sunday Nov 20th Pleasant with light airs and calm passed the *Gov. Troop* about 1 mile off middle and latter part pleasant with a light breeze from the Westward steering various courses Lat 47.07 N

Monday Nov 21st Pleasant with a fine breeze from the S E ship on the wind heading to the S W saw a sail latter part 237 fathoms wind the same broke out for water saw humpbacks saw a sail

Tuesday 22nd Nov Commences with light airs and calms ship heading various courses saw one humpback watches engaged in various duties middle and latter part pleasant with light breezes from the Westward course with watches engaged in breaking out to 58 fms of water as how much water there was on the Starboard side the Starboard side found 58 fms Lat 47.55 N Long 58.37 W

Wednesday 23rd Pleasant with a fine breeze from the Westward steering S E by East saw a sail to the windward she took in sail and we took in the light sails and pulled the mainmast middle and latter part pleasant with light airs steering various courses saw two ships and some pinbacks Lat 44.56 N Long 57.58 W

Thursday Nov 24th Pleasant with light airs from the Westward steering S E by S saw two ships and pinbacks and killed a hog latter part pleasant steering various courses saw a sail Lat 45.29 Long 58.08 by Lunar

Friday Nov 25th Pleasant with light airs from various quarters steering various courses saw plenty of pinbacks and a sail at sunset he took in sail we standing for him at 10 A M spoke for it was the *George Washington* of Warham crew the Capt came on board
