

Thursday January 5th Commences with squally weather and a fine breeze from the N.W. course W.S.W. with a heavy swell from the Southward saw porpoises and two sail both on the same road latter part pleasant with a strong breeze from the Westward ship heading S.W. on the wind No Obs to day

Friday January 6th Commences with a strong breeze from the Southward ship heading to the Westward on the wind middle and latter part plenty of snow and hail wind the same saw porpoises Lat 57.25 Sth Long 71.55 West

Saturday January 7th Commences with a gale from the Southward ship heading to the Westward on the wind at 2 P.M. saw a large Clipper ship belonging to Boston she was standing to the S on the wind at 1/2 past 2 P.M. she were ship heading in to the Westward at three P.M. carried away his mainmast at 6 P.M. passed as sending in his fly jill boom and sending down his royal yards latter part of squally with a strong breeze from the S.W. no Obs today

Sunday January 8th Commences with squally weather and a strong breeze from the S.W. ship heading to the Southward latter part more moderate ship under all sail heading to the N.W. on the wind Lat 55.20 Sth Long 73.10 W

Monday January 9th Commences with foggy weather and a light breeze from the N.W. ship heading to the Westward saw two sails latter part a strong breeze from the Northward ship heading to the S.W. no Obs

Tuesday January 10th Commences with a strong breeze from the Northward ship heading to the S.W. on the wind with thick foggy weather latter part a strong breeze from the Southward ship heading to the Westward saw porpoises No Obs

Wednesday January 11th Commences with a very heavy gale from the Southward ship bore too under the staysails and spencers lost the gangway rail and board stove the Starboard and Bow Boats shipping a great deal of Water but she lays fast in middle more moderate latter part pleasant with the wind to the Southward and a very heavy swell saw a Barge standing to the Westward at 1 P.M. made all sail saw porpoises Lat 55.39 Sth Long 78.17 West

Thursday January 12th Commences with a fine breeze from the Southward at 3 P.M. the wind hauled to the N.W. we backed ship heading N.W. on the wind at 7 P.M. raised the fore topsail and single reefed the mainmast and latter part thick foggy weather with a fine breeze from the N.W. Lat 55.35 Sth

Friday January 13th Commences with thick weather with the wind from the N.W. ship heading to the Westward on the wind at 4 P.M. the wind hauled to the Westward we then backed ship heading to the Southward saw a Barge to the windward latter part pleasant with a fine breeze from the Westward course N.W. saw three sail two bound home and one whaliship bound out supposed to be the Montpelier of New Bedford No Obs
