

Remarks on board Ship Hibernia of New Bedford

Saturday April 8th

Pleasant with a strong breeze from the NE course WNW all sail set at 4 o'clock saw a ship and exchanged signals with her supposed to be the Hercules of New Bedford bound to the Westward latter part pleasant and a strong breeze course W by N all sail set
Lat 21° 36' Long 168° 22' West

Sunday April 9th

Commenced with fine weather and a strong breeze from the NE course W by N all sail set nothing seen but porpoise latter part pleasant with a fine breeze from the course W by N all sail set nothing seen
Lat 22° 58' N Long

Monday April 10th

Commenced with a fine breeze from the East course W by N all sail set saw porpoises latter part pleasant with light airs and calms sent down the main topsail and mended it and put new points in it
Lat 23° 49' N Long

Tuesday April 11th

Pleasant with a fine breeze and course West saw Blackfish and porpoise latter part pleasant with light airs and calms Lat 24° 13' N

Wednesday April 12th

Commenced with fine weather and a light breeze from the Northward course W latter part pleasant and light airs from the Northward course ship heading W by N on the water nothing seen Lat 24° 55'

Tuesday April 13th

Commenced with a light breeze from the Northward with pleasant weather watches engaged in various duties latter part pleasant with light breezes from various quarters watches engaged in various duties
Lat 26° 06'

Wednesday April 14th

Commenced with pleasant weather and light breezes from various quarters at 1 o'clock saw a sail standing to the westward she ran down and it proved to be the Hobomok 7 days from Cape latter part pleasant the Hobomok in sight astern about 4 miles off
Lat 27° 33' Long 179° 58' West

Thursday April 15th

Commenced with pleasant weather and light airs from various quarters the Hobomok about 12 miles off astern latter part pleasant with light airs and calms in company with the Ship Hobomok of Falmouth
Lat 28° 23' Long 179° 06' East

Friday April 17th

Commenced with pleasant weather and light airs and calms at 8 o'clock parted company with the Hobomok and set the studsails kept her N by W latter part pleasant with light breezes from the SE course NW watches engaged in various duties nothing seen
Lat 29° 36' 178° 08' East

Saturday April 18th

Commenced with pleasant weather and light breezes from the SE course NW the Hobomok off our lee beam about 5 miles latter part pleasant with light breezes from the Southward steering various courses
Lat 30° 41'
