

Remarks on board Ship Hibernia of New Bedford

Wednesday April 19th Commences with pleasant weather and light breeze from the Sth course WNW saw Blackfish and finbacks the Kobomok off our lee Beam about ten miles distant latter part pleasant with light breezes from the Southward saw finbacks course WNW all sail set Lat 31.54 Nth Long 175.27 East

Thursday April 20th Commences with a fine breeze from the Southward course WNW all sail set saw finbacks and Porpoises watches engaged in various duties latter part thick and raining no Ob

Friday April 21st Commences with thick and foggy weather with rain at 4 PM backed ship and headed to the Westward on the wind latter part pleasant with the wind to the NE ship heading to the NW Lat 34.10 Long 172.06

Saturday April 22nd Commences with pleasant weather and a fine breeze from the NE East ship heading to the NW latter part pleasant with a fine breeze from the SW course NW by Nth No Ob

Sunday April 23rd Commences with thick weather and a gale from the Southward course NW by Nth latter part pleasant with a fine breeze from the SW course NW by Nth Lat 37.45

Monday April 24th Commences with a light gale from the Westward latter part a gale from the Westward Lat 38.57 167.37 East

Tuesday April 25th Commences with pleasant weather and a strong breeze from the Westward ship heading NW on the wind under double reefed topsails and courses at 7 AM set whole topsails saw a ship off the lee Beam latter part calm and light air from various quarters a sail astern at noon a light breeze from the Eastward Lat 40.06 Nth

Wednesday April 26th Commences with misty weather and a strong breeze from the Eastward course NW spoke the Fox Troup and Capt Honywell went on board of her latter part a thick fog with rain No Ob

Thursday April 27th Commences with thick foggy weather the Fox Troup in sight course NW by W at 7 AM took in the tight sails and double reefed the topsails latter part pleasant with a fine breeze from the NW ship heading to the Westward on the wind the Fox Troup astern Lat 43.01 Long 163

Friday April 28th Commences with pleasant weather and a fine breeze from the NW ship heading different courses on the Wind at 7 AM single reefed the topsails made a potato fire and put some of the potatoes in it latter part snow squalls and a strong breeze from the NW at daylight made all sail no sail in sight Lat 43.58 Nth Long 163.11
