

Ship *Kuburica* Right Whaling in the  
Thursday Oct 5th Commences with fine weather and a fine  
breeze spoke the *Barque Edward* two right  
whales this season saw a few right whales  
and several ships the Capt lowered  
his Boat at dark for a whale with  
success then came on board *right whale*  
latter part pleasant with a fine breeze  
saw whales lowered without success



Friday Oct 6th Commences with a strong breeze from the  
Nth and squally weather saw whales  
lowered without success saw plenty  
of ships latter part squally with strong  
breezes saw whales but too rugged to lower  
saw several ships

Oct 7th Saturday Squally with a strong breeze saw whales  
but too rugged to lower for them  
latter part squally with a light gale ship  
under close reefed topsails saw two ships  
and one or two right whales but too rugged  
to lower

Sunday Oct 8th Squally with a strong breeze from the  
Nth ship under close reefed topsails  
saw whales but too rugged to lower  
latter part wind and weather the same  
saw three ships bound off

Monday Oct 9th Commences with hail squalls and rain  
with a gale from the Nth ship  
hove to under close reefed topsails two  
more ships hove to to the windward  
of us latter part strong breeze and  
rugged weather saw plenty of right  
whales but too rugged to lower

Chotsk Sea Lat 53° 20' N Long 151° 25' East  
Tuesday Oct 10th Commences with fine weather and a strong  
breeze from the Nth ship heading to the Nth  
on the wind saw plenty of whales but could  
not lower it was too rugged no ships in sight  
latter part pleasant with light breezes  
saw one whale lowered without success

Wednesday Oct 11th Commences with squally weather and a fine  
breeze saw several whales all going quick  
to the windward saw a ship to the windward  
chasing whales all day at sunset shortened  
sail for the night *Tom* sick *David* with a  
lamed finger *Richard* with a boil on his ass  
*Brown* with a pain in the Back and *Swest*  
and *Riley* with all sorts and the Capt  
with the *iglyps* and *Mr* *Stines* with the  
Rheumatism latter part a gale of wind  
with heavy snow squalls saw one ship hove  
to *Glory* saw two whales ship hove too  
under close reefed topsails and foremast  
staysail Lat 53° 01' N Long 151° 23' East

Thursday  
Wednesday Oct 12th Commences with a gale from the Nth  
ship hove too under close reefed topsails and  
staysails at 9 A.M. kept her S S E and  
single reefed the fore and main topsails  
and set the main topgallant sail and  
foresail latter part pleasant with a  
strong breeze course S S E carried away  
the fore topgallant yard while hoisting it

Friday  
Thursday Oct 13th Pleasant with a strong breeze ship  
under single reefed topsails and courses  
S S E saw two ships and the *Sand*  
latter part a strong breeze stood out  
through the starts got through a  
gale and made all sail ready
