

Ship Wilunia off Cape St Lucas cruising 1855

Tuesday January 23^d Commences with a strong breeze from the N^W heading N^E on the wind nothing seen Capt Honeywell still the same he has done everything that he or we can think of but nothing seems to help him latter part pleasant with a light breeze from N^W nothing seen
Lat 23.19 Nth

Wednesday January 24th Pleasant weather and a fine breeze from the N^W heading to the ~~N^W~~ East on the wind watches engaged in various duties saw a whale turn flukes after the sunset but did not see him spout about twenty minutes afterwards saw a whale spout once and make white water but saw no flukes took in the light sails and hauled up the courses at 11 A^M wore ship and headed to the ~~N^W~~ on the wind latter part pleasant with a light breeze from the N^W at 7 P^M wore ship and headed to the Westward on the wind Captain about the same took a vessel
Lat 23.09 Nth Long 107.41.30 West

Thursday January 25th Pleasant with a fine breeze from the Westward ship on the wind heading W^{SW} saw a sail to the windward and one finback and the land about 50 miles distant three points on the weather low watches engaged in breaking out between decks and steering off latter part fine weather and a light breeze saw plenty of Blackfish lowered and got one
Lat 22.44 Nth Long 108.25 West

Friday January 26th Pleasant with a light breeze from the N^W ship heading various courses saw Killers to day Capt Honeywell feels rather better watches engaged in various duties latter part pleasant but calm saw Blackfish lowered and shared without success Lat 22.48 Nth

Saturday January 27th Commences with fine weather and calm saw Blackfish lowered chased and struck one and drawn latter part clear but calm saw Blackfish and Humpbacks

Sunday January 28th Pleasant with light air and calms saw Humpbacks watches engaged in various duties Capt Honeywell on deck very well latter part fine weather saw Blackfish nothing doing

Monday January 29th Pleasant saw Blackfish going quick did not lower for them latter part pleasant saw Blackfish and finbacks did not lower for them Capt making Blacks and Mr. Sheffield mending the old Boat watches engaged in various duties Lat 22.39 Nth

Tuesday January 30th Pleasant at 2 A^M lowered for Blackfish but without success came on board at sunset latter part pleasant with light air and calms ship heading to the Southward engaged in various duties saw Blackfish and finbacks Lat 22.01 Nth

Wednesday January 31st Pleasant with fine S^E trades steering West nothing seen engaged in various duties latter part squally with baffling winds nothing ship on the wind heading various courses to the

Thursday February 1st Commences with squally weather and baffling winds Land in sight middle part pleasant with a fine breeze from the N^W best course N^W latter part pleasant with light air and calms nothing seen of any note but one finback
Lat 23.03 Long 110.50 West

Friday February 2nd Pleasant with a light breeze from the N^W ship heading to the Westward on the wind at 4 A^M lowered for Blackfish the larboard Boat struck one and the Starboard Boat shot a Carfish and saved them both latter part rainy weather and light air saw Humpbacks Lat 23.03 Nth

Saturday February 3rd Squally weather and light air and calms steering various courses latter part squally steering in for the Land nothing seen
