

Friday May 4th Commences with thick foggy weather blowing a light gale no sail out but double reefed Main Top-sail and foresail steering East at 6 AM kept by East by 11th under the same sail engaged in getting barks ready for to put Water. Latter part thick foggy weather saw finbacks

Saturday May 5th Pleasant with a fine breeze bound for Cape St Lucas after Water engaged in getting barks ready for to put Water in latter part light air and thick weather ship running down along the Land nothing seen

Sunday May 6th Pleasant with light air ship running down along shore nothing seen latter part pleasant spoke the Bark Valparaiso 75 tons this season

Monday May 7th A strong breeze run in to the ship and came to an anchor in twelve fathoms Water and gave her 50 fathoms of Chain then got ready to get off Water

Tuesday May 8th Getting off Water and stowing it away latter part the same

Wednesday May 9th Pleasant engaged in getting off Water latter part the same

Thursday May 10th Pleasant getting off Water latter part finished getting off Water and saw one Watch on liberty

Friday May 11th Pleasant finished stowing down the Water and washed off the decks latter part pleasant sent the other Watch on liberty

Saturday May 12th Pleasant all hands came off also discharged the Steward and shipped another one also shipped a komaka latter part all hands on board got the ship under way and stowed the anchors and Chain

Sunday May 13th Pleasant saw two sail on supposed to be the Bark John Henry Parker latter part pleasant saw two sail and some Humphreys

Monday May 14th Pleasant nothing seen latter part pleasant saw Humphreys engaged in mending the jib

Tuesday May 15th Pleasant saw Humphreys engaged in repairing the jib latter part pleasant nothing seen

Wednesday May 16th Pleasant saw Humphreys latter part engaged in repairing the rigworks and various other duties

Thursday May 17th Pleasant engaged in various duties saw three Barks also saw Humphreys latter part pleasant spoke the Bark Valparaiso and gamed with her also saw several other vessels

Friday May 18th Pleasant in company with the Val saw another Bark and spoke the Ship Richard Mitchell of Newmarket nothing latter part pleasant the Valparaiso in sight

Saturday May 19th Pleasant the Valparaiso ten miles to the leeward latter part a strong breeze not much doing

Sunday May 20th Pleasant with a strong breeze saw the Val to the leeward latter part no ship in sight
