

Monday May 21<sup>st</sup> Pleasant with a strong breeze  
Nothing seen one Frenchman very sick and  
the other one complaining latter part a strong  
breeze nothing seen

Tuesday May 22<sup>nd</sup> Pleasant with a strong breeze engaged  
in various duties nothing seen latter part more  
moderate nothing seen one Man Wore today

Wednesday May 23<sup>rd</sup> Pleasant with a fine breeze all sail set  
saw Albion watches engaged in various duties one  
of the Men still worse today and the other complaining  
latter part a strong breeze nothing doing nothing seen

Thursday May 24<sup>th</sup> Pleasant with a strong breeze engaged  
in various duties latter part a strong breeze ship  
on different tacks nothing seen

Friday May 25<sup>th</sup> Pleasant engaged in various duties  
latter part pleasant saw Blackfish

Saturday May 26<sup>th</sup> Pleasant engaged in various duties  
at 5 AM raised Sperm Whales going  
quick to the windward got within three  
quarters of a mile of them by dark with  
the ship latter part pleasant saw  
Blackfish

Sunday May 27<sup>th</sup> Pleasant saw Blackfish and  
Sulphur Bottoms also saw a Bank running  
down to us it proved to be the Valparaiso  
nothing since seeing him last latter part  
raised whales lowered the boats for them

Monday May 28<sup>th</sup> Pleasant with a light breeze  
Boats off after whales the Starboard  
Waist and Bow Boats struck we got  
them alongside and made fast for the night  
latter part calmed all hands at daylight  
and out in the Whales saw two sail  
to the windward

Tuesday May 29<sup>th</sup> Pleasant finished cutting in and cleared  
away the heads and started the works saw Blackfish  
latter part pleasant engaged in boiling saw two sail

Wednesday May 30<sup>th</sup> Pleasant saw Blackfish and two sail and  
spoke the Valparaiso watches engaged in boiling  
latter part pleasant saw Blackfish and two sail

Thursday May 31<sup>st</sup> Pleasant watches engaged in boiling  
saw two sail latter part pleasant finished  
boiling saw a Barge to the windward of us it  
was the Bark Morning Star of New Bedford  
has taken forty Barrels this season

Friday June 1<sup>st</sup> Pleasant weather saw Cowfish and two sail  
watches engaged in various duties latter part  
thick fog with baffling winds

Saturday June 2<sup>nd</sup> Commences with baffling winds and calms  
at 4 AM took in all sail but Double reefed  
Main Topsail and foresail and Spanker at 7 AM  
hauling up the foresail and took in the Spanker  
latter part more moderate with light baffling wind.

Sunday June 3<sup>rd</sup> Commences with light wind and hazy weather  
saw Blackfish latter part weather the same saw  
Blackfish

Monday June 4<sup>th</sup> Pleasant with light air and hazy weather  
saw Blackfish and one Sulphur Bottom latter  
part pleasant engaged in stowing down oil

Tuesday June 5<sup>th</sup> Pleasant engaged in stowing down oil saw  
the same but no whales latter part pleasant  
at 10 PM raised Sperm Whales lowered  
and chased them to the windward
