with light wind spoke the Bark Lagrange

Wednesday June 23rd Pleasant nothing seen watches engaged
in various duties latter part with light wind
nothing seen but Sulphur Bottoms

Thursday June 24th Pleasant with a light breeze spoke
the Bark Belle of Warren latter part pleasant
saw Porpoises and Sunfish ship steering various courses

Friday June 25th Pleasant with a fine breeze steering
various courses at 7 A.M. spoke the Bark Belle
and carried all sail steering N.E. by E. latter
part pleasant in company with the Bark Belle

Saturday June 26th Pleasant with a fine breeze at 4 A.M. spoke
the Ship Gayelle of Charleston saw two or three
other vessels latter part pleasant saw three sail
and some Blackfish watches engaged in steering
down oil

Sunday June 27th Pleasant with a fine breeze finished
steering down and washed off the decks latter
part pleasant nothing seen but ships

Monday June 28th Pleasant at 7 A.M. spoke the Bark Belle
of New Bedford 300 bbls this season latter
part pleasant with light wind saw three sail
but no whales

Tuesday June 29th Pleasant with light air saw Blackfish
and Whales at sunset shortened sail and lay
with the fore-sail aback latter part pleasant
nothing seen but sail

Wednesday June 30th Pleasant spoke the Bark Belle nothing
since we see her last latter part pleasant spoke
the Bark Manning saw seven whales once in forty-two days

Thursday July 1st Pleasant saw Humpbacks at 10 A.M.
spoke the Ship Pantheon of New Bedford 200 sperm
and 70 Humpback Capt shot his hand all to pieces
latter part pleasant saw Humpbacks

Friday July 2nd Pleasant with light air and calms saw
Humpbacks and the Land about 80 miles distant
latter part light air and calms saw Humpbacks
and Porpoises

Saturday July 3rd Pleasant with light air and calms
steering for the Cape saw Humpbacks latter
part pleasant spoke the Ship Keeper of Fair Haven
clear saw plenty of Blackfish and Grampas

Sunday July 4th Pleasant saw ten thousand Blackfish and
twelve sail all with masts down we are
bound to the windward latter part pleasant saw
Blackfish and three sail

Monday July 5th Pleasant spoke the Bark Hydaspes of
New Bedford latter part light air and calms
saw Blackfish and finbacks and two sail

Tuesday July 6th Pleasant saw Blackfish lowered
and the Waist Boat struck and sunk
the Harbor and Bow Boats struck
and took them to the ship and then
cleared them away latter part pleasant with
light air and calms

Wednesday July 7th Pleasant with light air and calms saw
Blackfish lowered without success latter part
light air and calms Porpoises

Thursday July 8th Pleasant with light air and calms
nothing seen latter part light air and calms
nothing seen
