

Monday July 9th Pleasant with light air from the N. N. W.
at 2 P. M. tacked and stood to the N. E. nothing seen
latter part fine weather nothing seen

Tuesday July 10th Pleasant with a fine breeze latter part
thick heavy weather with a strong breeze saw three
sail one boiling

Wednesday July 11th Commenced with thick foggy weather
spoke the *Arrowheads* of *Talmon* 200 this
noon also saw the *Bark Belle* saw whales
four times since we see him last
latter part thick fog at 10 P. M. cleared
off and the *Gazelle* raised whales we lowered
and the *Valparaiso* boat also lowered without

Thursday July 12th Thick fog ship laying aback
the Capt of the *Valparaiso* came on
board of us latter part thick fog
the *Valparaiso* close to us the Capt
went on board of her and got some *Inns*

Friday 13th Thick fog ship laying under Double
reefed Main Toppail and foresail and
spanker and staysail latter part pleasant
by spells nothing seen

Saturday July 14th Pleasant raised Whales lowered and
the *Laibard* Boat struck the other boats
struck soon afterwards killed and took
alongside and cut them all in latter part
pleasant cleared away the heads and
started the works

Sunday July 15th Pleasant engaged in boiling
saw Blackfish. latter part the same

Monday July 16th Pleasant weather saw plenty of Blackfish
and three ships engaged in boiling finished at 11 A. M.
latter part fine weather saw Blackfish and Ships

Tuesday July 17th Pleasant weather and a fine breeze spoke the
Bark Valparaiso and the ship *Covina* of *Knob*
latter part pleasant with a fine breeze saw seven
sail and some Porpoises

Wednesday July 18th Pleasant saw Blackfish and seven
sail but no sperm Whales latter part pleasant
with a fine breeze saw four sail

Thursday July 19th Pleasant with a light breeze saw Blackfish
at 7 A. M. spoke the *Richard Mitchell* of *Knob*
saw three more sail pumped ship and pumped oil
latter part pleasant saw Blackfish

Friday July 20th Pleasant with light air and calms saw
Blackfish and Porpoises and three sail latter part
pleasant saw four sail all hands engaged in stowing
down oil

Saturday July 21st Pleasant saw Blackfish all hands engaged
in stowing down oil at 7 A. M. made all sail
ship heading to the Westward stood firm watches
latter part pleasant with a strong breeze nothing seen

Sunday July 22nd Pleasant with a strong breeze took
in the light sails at 4 A. M. double reefed
the topsails and at 6 A. M. furled the mainsail
saw plenty of finbacks latter part a strong
breeze ship under double reefed topsails and courses

Monday July 23rd Pleasant with a strong breeze from the West
lost the Main topgallant sail and steered Nth
as a course saw one finback latter part pleasant
passed the ship *Richard Mitchell*
