

Saturday April 5th Continued and if he made a noise to knock him down and stun him so that he could not make a noise whether they killed him or not and that they had their clothes on deck and two Bags of Bread and they was all on their way aft at the time that Joseph Richardson started forward and said we are caught so they all went below again and turned in and that the cause of their wanting to run away was that the captain would not let them have a Boat on Sunday to go after clams so the captain took his shoes off and tied his hands with a piece of sewing stuff and put him below again

Sunday April 6th Pleasant with a fine breeze course W S Wt all sail set saw Blackfish latter part wind and weather the same course Wt by Sth all sail set

Monday April 7th Pleasant had the Prisoners on deck about an hour and gave them their meals as usual nothing seen latter part pleasant had the Prisoners on deck about an hour nothing seen

Tuesday April 8th Pleasant with a fine breeze all sail set saw Blackfish watches engaged in picking oakum for the salt the Ship latter part pleasant with light winds course Wt by Sth all sail set

Wednesday April 9th Pleasant with light breezes watches engaged in picking oakum had the Prisoners on deck about an hour and a half latter part pleasant saw a ship bound to the other course Sth by Wt

Thursday April 10th Pleasant had the birds on deck nearly all day latter part pleasant had them on deck all the forenoon watches engaged in various duties course Sth by Wt

Friday April 11th Pleasant with a fine breeze all sail set course W S W

latter part pleasant with a fine breeze all sail set had the Prisoners on deck and let them wash and change their clothes

Saturday April 12th Pleasant with a fine breeze all sail set course Wt by Sth latter part pleasant with all sail set watches engaged in various duties had the Prisoners on deck and gave them their meals as usual

Sunday April 13th Commenced with squally weather with strong trades all sail set course Wt by Sth latter part squally with strong trades all sail set nothing doing

Monday April 14th Strong trades and squally weather all sail set course Wt by Sth at 6 A M had the men out of the main on deck to give them their supper they wanted a little writing upon so I called on Marshall to help them and he came along grumbling and told me that this was the last time he would do it I told him as he was one of the gang that was a going to take a boat I should call on him when I wanted him he said that he knew what ships duty was and he be damned if he would do it I told the Captain what he said and the Captain called him aft and talked to him and told him if he refused to do anything that he was told to do he would put him in Irons and put him in the main and not give him anything to eat for three days latter part pleasant with a strong breeze all sail set

Tuesday April 15th Pleasant with a strong breeze course Wt by Sth all sail set latter part pleasant with a fine breeze course Wt by Sth nothing seen

Wednesday April 16th Pleasant with a fine breeze sent down the Spanker and repaired it latter part pleasant with a fine breeze watches engaged in mending sails
