

Remarks on Board Ship Hibernia Capt. Honeywell

Saturday June 7th 1856

Commenced with a light wind S.E. Ship heading N.N.W. with land in sight distant 20 miles Middle and latter part light winds from North Ship on the wind

Sunday June 8th

Came in with strong breeze and a heavy head sea took in top yards ship on different tacks waiting to the northward at 7 o'clock double reefed the main topsail took fore and main topsails jib and main sail ship dumping to heavy to carry sail Middle part the same latter part light wind from N.N.E. made all sail heading east with thick and rainy

Monday June 9th

This 24 hours commenced with light wind from N.E. with thick rainy weather ship heading E by S. Middle part light winds at 2 o'clock took ship heading N.N.W. at 7 o'clock A.M. took to the eastward with light winds and a heavy swell from the N.E. and fine weather saw several humpbacks

Tuesday June 10th

Commenced with light winds from the northward with fine weather Ship heading E.N.E. Middle part light variable winds latter part light winds from N.W. heading N by E.

Wednesday June 11th

Came in with light airs and calms at 5 A.M. took a light breeze from S.W. heading N.W. by N Middle part the same latter part light winds from S.E. strong N.W. at 7 A.M. Rose Island in sight bearing N.N.E. distance 7 miles

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Thursday June 12th

Came in with moderate breeze from E.N.E. Ship heading S.E. Montague and Rose Island in sight at 7 P.M. double reefed the topsails Middle part strong breezes close reefed the fore topsail took in the jib and main sail thick and rainy latter moderate made all sail light winds and fine weather with a heavy sea running

Friday June 13th

Commenced with light airs and calms. Ship heading S.E. Middle part light winds at 2 o'clock took a breeze from S.E. steering east latter part strong breeze took in top gallant sails and double reefed the topsails so ends

Saturday June 14th

This 24 hours came in with strong breezes from E.S.E. took in the jib and main sail close reefed the fore and main topsails ship on the wind thick and rainy Middle part much the same took in fore topsail latter part moderate made sail heading S.S.E.

Sunday June 15th

Came in with light winds from the east Ship heading S.S.E. at 4 P.M. took to the northward light wind and a very heavy swell running hauled up the courses and blew down the topsails Middle part calm lay with the topsails blown down at 6 o'clock took a breeze from S.E. made all sail heading E.S.E. thick foggy and rain -

Monday June 16th

This day came in with moderate breeze from N.E. with thick weather Ship heading E.S.E. at 7 P.M. took in top gallant sails Middle part the same latter part moderate made all sail heading E.S.E. at 10 A.M. saw ship heading S by West with the wind out of the westward with rain
