

Remarks on Board Ship Hibernia Capt John Honeywell

Saturday July 3rd

This 24 hours comes in with light airs and calms ship heading S.W. nothing in sight Middle and latter part light winds from S.W. with fine weather ship heading N.W. employed scraping Bone

Sunday July 4th

This 24 hours comes in with light winds from S.W. ship heading N.W. the land in sight no right whol in to day Middle and latter part light airs and calms

Monday July 5th

Comes in with light airs and calms spoke B.R. took nothing this season Middle and latter part strong breezes at 3 1/2 o'clock called all hands took in fore and main topsail and commenced stowing down oil

Tuesday July 6th

This 24 hours comes in with moderate breezes from S.W. at 2 o'clock finished stowing down made all sail and cleared up the decks wet drizely weather Middle and latter part the same

Wednesday July 7th

This day comes in with moderate winds from S. covered for whales struck one and the line drawn lowered the boat again but could not strike Middle part light winds ship laying under topsails latter part strong breezes from S.E. ship heading S.W. studding sails down and do not saw one whole this morning the capr lowered his boat but did not strike we are now bound into the Kamoo sea

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Thursday 10th July

Comes in with a moderate gale from S.E. with thick weather took in studding sail and double reefed the topsails Middle part the same latter part the wind hauled to the southward and moderate made sail steering S.E.W.

Friday July 11th

This 24 hours comes in with moderate winds from S.E. at 4 P.M. the wind hauled to the east set studding sails steering S.E.W. Middle part wind hauled to the North latter part light winds Kodiak Island in sight distance 15 m. plenty humpbacks in sight

Saturday July 12th

This 24 hours comes in with light airs and calms with a heavy swell closed down the topsails at 4 P.M. took a light breeze from the eastward made sail again steering S.E. Middle part calm latter part took a breeze from the west ship heading S.E.W.

Sunday July 13th

This 24 hours comes in with moderate winds from the westward ship heading S.E.W. Cooper employed setting up shooks Middle and latter part light wind and fine weather

Monday July 14th

This 24 hours comes in with strong breezes from the South at 2 P.M. the wind hauled to the S.E. ship heading S.W. By S. set studding sails at 7 P.M. wind increased took in studding sails and Mizzen topsail thick and rainy Middle and latter part moderate made sail
