

Remarks on Board Ship *Hibernia* Capt. Honeywell

Sunday October 26th 1836

Comes in with a moderate breeze from E. N. E. running for the Harbour of Poekia at 6 P.M. the pilot came on board at 7 1/2. Came to an anchor in 8 fathoms water and gave her 245 fathoms chain the Kanaka that had been sick some time and this morning.

Monday Oct 27th

Comes in with light wind from N. W. with fine weather barouely employed took 206 c. meat on board buried the Kanaka on shore.

Tuesday Oct 28th

Comes in with light wind and fine weather got off 41 lbs potatoes.

Wednesday Oct 29th

At 3 o'clock this morning got underway bound to Oahu with a light wind from the N. at 9 A.M. took the trade blowing strong.

Thursday Oct 30th

A day light Diamond head bearing N. by E. distance 5 miles. at 8 A.M. off the Harbour of Honolulu the steamer took us in tow at 8 1/2 came to an anchor in the harbour employed mooring ship and bundling bone.

Friday Nov 15th

Pleasant with a strong breeze got some men on board and got the ship off and outside got the anchors up and double reefed the topsails and set the watch for the night latter part pleasant engaged in setting up rigging and getting out the fly jib boom.

Saturday November 16th 1836

Pleasant engaged in various duties got some of the men off latter part pleasant sent off two men.

Sunday November 16th

Pleasant engaged in setting up rigging and clearing up the decks latter part pleasant with light air ship laying off and on nothing doing.

Monday November 17th

Pleasant ship laying off and on at Oahu nothing doing latter part pleasant engaged in various duties.

Tuesday November 18th

Pleasant watches engaged in various duties latter part Pleasant with light air and calm.

Wednesday November 19th

Pleasant but calm watches engaged in various duties latter part pleasant with variable wind kept lame on board made sail and stood to the S. E.

Thursday Nov 20th

Pleasant with a fine breeze from the S. W. steering to the Eastward watches engaged in clearing up between decks latter part strong wind from the S. E. ship heading to the S. W. the wind.

Friday November 21st

Pleasant with strong breeze from the S. E. watches engaged in various duties latter part sent down the mainmast and repaired it.

Saturday Nov 22nd

Pleasant with strong breeze from the S. E. ship heading S. W. on the wind double reefed topsails and courses latter part pleasant with strong wind.
