at 4 and 4 1/2 P.M. called all hands up to mend
sails and fit up the rigging when some of them
allowed they wanted their forenoon watch below
and that it belonged to them and they could
not go to work unless they had their watch
below and the Capt talked and reasoned with
them but they would not listen to him no
way so he told me to put Charles English
in Irons and put him in the run and
done so the Capt then went on deck and
talked to ~~Mr~~ A. Beech and he said he
had made up his mind to go in the run
to for he could not lose his Watch below
for that belonged to him so I put him
in Irons to and put him in the run to

part pleasant called all hands to mend sails and fit
and then rigging the Harbour Watch said they wanted
their watch below and the Capt talked to them and

watches engaged in setting up shocks

Pleasant with light air and calm saw B. fish
watches engaged in setting up shocks latter
part pleasant with light wind

Pleasant with a fine breeze watches engaged
in various duties latter part baffling wind

ship on the wind with the light sails pulled
latter part wind and weather the same
