Monday April 13th
Today hired two coopers and fourteen men to work on
the oil engaged in breaking out and coopers the oil
find it in very bad order

Tuesday April 14th
Today engaged in breaking out and coopers the oil found
several casks that are not fit to stow again
Wednesday April 15th
Engaged in coopers and stowing oil find the sperm
oil in quite good order with the exception of a few casks
that are a little thick
Thursday April 16th
Engaged in coopers and stowing oil
Friday April 17th
Pleasant with the wind from the Nth engaged in
coopers and stowing the oil men cask good for now
Saturday April 18th
Today blowing a gale from the Nth with rain both
anchors down with fifty five fathoms on one anchor and
thirty on the other nothing doing on account of the weather
Sunday April 19th
Pleasant nothing doing
Monday April 20th
Today engaged in coopers and stowing oil
six men hired and two coopers finished the oil

Tuesday April 21st
Today to work stowing off and filling salt water six men
hired and three men forgot to come on board
Wednesday April 22nd
Today not much doing let the men go ashore
Thursday April 23rd
Today took in water 1878 Gallons and got off potatoes
Friday April 24th
Today not much doing some ashore and some on board
Saturday April 25th
Today got of Meat and Molasses and wood and flour
Sunday April 26th
Today blowing a rather some of the men castore
both anchors down with sixty fathoms of chain on
one anchor and thirty on the other
Monday April 27th
Today all hands engaged in stowing away provisions
and wood

These 24 hours light breeze and pleasant weather with on being
