

Ship Hibernia from Talcahuana towards New
Bedford John M. Hunsaywell Master July 29th 1857

Commences calm and clear saw a Brig to the South

Latter part light airs from SE and clear 2 sail in sight course
NW by N So End Obs Lat 32.45 N

Thursday 30th

Commences with a light breeze from SE by S and clear weather
one sail in sight

Latter part light winds from SE and pleasant weather painted
the boat to End all sail set Obs Lat 33.35 N

Friday 31st

Commences with light winds from the South with light rain squalls
course NW by N

Latter part fresh breeze from SSW course NW by N the Bark
Sea Bird of Boston steering SE and still took in the standing sails

So End

Obs Lat 34.35 North

Saturday August 1st

Commences with a fresh breeze from SW and pleasant weather
saw a sail standing to the South by the wind

Latter part blowing strong from the SW and still took in top 3 sails
and flying jib and 3 studding sails the fore topsail to End

Obs Lat 35.00 N

Sunday 2

Commences with a strong breeze from SW and cloudy weather
and 2 P.M. double reefed the main and mizen topsails Stopped by the
wind heading Whelp

Latter part strong winds from SW and squally ship under
double reefed topsails course and jib to End

Sun 3rd

Monday 3rd

Commences with a fresh breeze from SW and 2 P.M. wind still
turned and the reefs and 3 P.M. windward lashed to stow
saw a Brig steering to the Eastward

Latter part strong winds and varying from SSW to WSW
with squalls of wind and rain and 3 P.M. lashed to the
Westward ship under double reefed topsails to End

Obs Lat 36.43 N

Tuesday 4th

Commences with a strong breeze from SW and rainy and
light winds from NW more ship to the westward

Latter part calm and clear and sent the fore and main
topsails bent as thus So End Obs Lat 35.52 N
