Thursday Sept the 12 1844

The first of these is heavy strong wind from S had the first of these 24 hours light winds from N E by
-ing E S & at 6 P.M. was ship and heading W by N steering S & the watch picking same as the

Saturday Sept the 14th 1833

The first part of March is hours blowing a gale from N^W steering S & we double reefed the fore top^{sail} and took in the Bow Boat and hoisted up the others the middle blowing a heavy gale and a heavy sea steering S & by 10 we took in the fore topsail the latter more moderate and hading S & the watches employed in ships duty turned 4 reefs out of the main topsail and set the fore and turned out one reef the wind W steering E by S

Sunday Sept^r the 15th 1844

The first of these 24 hours light winds from S 40°
steering E S E at 9 PM wore ship and heading S by E the
middle strong winds from E heading S S E took in the
top gallowsails and hoath reefed the main topsail the
latter heavy winds from E by N heading S S E took in
the gill mainsail and fore topsail and hoath reefed
the main

Saturday Sept the 21st 1844
The first part of these 24 strong winds from N 40°
we lowered 3 times for right which but got more
at 11 PM took in all sail except close reefed main
topgall and fore topsail stay sail the middle strong
winds from N 40° the latter strong winds from S 40°
steering E S E made a N sail Lat 34-5 Long 112-5

Monday Sept the 16th 1844

The first of these 21 hours heavy wind from E & backing to E at 4 P.M. the wind shifted to the westward we took a long N & by E the middle cabin the latter light the mizen top sail squally thunder lightning rain and hail at 11 P.M. from W & Starling E & S & saw fairbanks & P.M. took in the foresail the middle boom made all sail at 1 P.M. with the Ice Berge at 9 saw a Right whale and lowered for him at 11 the boats returned without success light was from W & Starling E & S about 20 Ice Berge in sight but S & T =
Long 217 = 54

Thursday Sept the 17th 1844

The first of these 24 hours light winds from N^W by N steering S^E the watch taking same as for salt water on harbor side to trim ship. The Bergs in sight the middle light winds from N^W by N steering S^E by E we took in the light sails the latter light airs from E heading S^E & made all sail saw the Berg fine weather Lat 38=09 Long 28=55 June 28=00
Wednesday Left the 15th 1844

Monday Sept the 10th 1844

The first of these 24 hour light winds from NW or W turning SE by E at 5 P.M. took in the light sails and mainsail saw a sail the middle strong winds from SW or steering to the better strong breezes from SE or E steering. I made all sail saw forebuds. Lat 17-08 Long 91-25-0

Thursday Sept the 19th 1844

The first of these 20 hours light winds from S S E heading E the middle light winds from E S E heading N E the latter light winds from E N E we tacked ship and heading S S E the watches employed in ships duty was foreback Lat 35-54 Long

Friday Sept the 20th 1844

Had 24 hours strong wind from E. N. & heading S
by E saw fine back thick weather. Lot gone

Saturday Sept the 21st 1844

The first part of the 24 strong wind from N & E
we bowed 3 times for right which but got more
to N. PM took in all sail except close reefed main
top sail and fore topmast stay sail the middle strong
winds from N the latter strong winds from S. E
steering E S E made all sail Lat 34-5 Long 112

Sunday Sept the 22 1844

The first of these is hoarse light winds from S & head-
ing N & E by E the middle calm the latter light
winds from W & steering E S & saw fairbanks
thick cloudy weather
