

Remarks On Board Ship *Ho-bomok*

Tuesday Dec the 11th 1844

The first of these 24 hours strong winds from NW steering NE & the middle strong winds from NW steering NE & by 100 the latter light winds from NW steering NE & by 100 we brought out betw- decks to shift the hoops for weather saw nothing Lat 46-55 Long 172-50

Wednesday Jan the 1st 1845

The first of these 24 hours light winds from NW steering NE & by 100 we finished steering the middle and latter light winds from SE steering NE & by 8 saw finbacks Lat 46-10 Long 176-00

Thursday Jan the 2nd 1845

The first of these 24 hours light winds from SE steering E NE & the middle strong winds from SE steering E NE & the latter light winds from SE steering E by 10 we caught a porpoise saw finbacks Lat 45-27 Long

Friday Jan the 3rd 1845

The first and middle light winds from NW steering E by 100 we caught a porpoise the latter light winds from NW steering E by 100 at 4 P.M. saw and lowered for a night whale the barboat struck and dived at 11 boats returned saw finbacks Lat 45-40 Long 179-07

Saturday Jan the 4th 1845

The first part of these 24 hours light winds from NW steering E we took in the Mast and Bow Boat and put out new one the middle and latter light winds from NW steering E saw blackfish and finbacks Lat 46-05 Long 176-45

Sunday Jan the 5th 1845

The first of these 24 hours light winds from NW steering E & the middle and latter light winds from NW steering SE & saw finbacks and porpoise Lat 48-19 Long 174-20

These 24 hours strong winds from NW heading E by NW saw blackfish and finbacks Lat 48-18

Tuesday Jan the 7th 1845

The first of these 24 hours strong winds from NW by NW heading NW by ~~20~~ 10 at 5 P.M. took in gill maul and double reeled the two sails same rain at 4 took in fore and main topsail the middle the wind shifted to the S by 10 we were ship and made sail steering NW by S the latter light winds steering NE by NW by 100 saw finbacks Lat 48-18 Long 172-37

Wednesday Jan the 8th 1845

The first and middle light winds from SE the latter calm the watches employed in ship's duty saw finbacks Lat 45-27 Long

Thursday Jan the 9th 1845

The first and middle light winds from SE steering NE NW the latter light winds from SE steering NE NW foggy Lat 45-31 Long 173-01

Friday Jan the 10th 1845

The first of these 24 hours light winds from SE steering NE NW the middle strong winds we took in the light sails and hoisted up the courses and steering NW by SE the latter strong winds from SE steering NW by SE saw finbacks Lat 44-41 Long 174-58

Saturday Jan the 11th 1845

The first of these 24 hours strong winds from SE steering NW by 100 at 5 P.M. saw Chat Island at 5 P.M. heaved to the wind heading by NW at 4 double reeled Chatam Is. bearing 70° W dist 90 miles the middle light winds heading S by NW the latter strong winds from SE heading E NE the land in sight saw finbacks Lat 45-00 Long 177-00
