

Remarks On Board Ship *Herbivore*

Sunday Jan the 12th 1845

The first of these 24 hours strong winds from S by E at 7 PM shortened sail. The bearing 15 miles off the middle strong winds from S by E latter strong wind from S by E 15 miles off saw blackfish. Lat 44-45 Long 110-20

Monday Jan the 13th 1845

The first of these 24 hours strong winds from S by E at 12 PM 2 boats went to a rock fishing there was an English boat come on with some potatoes at 4 the boats returned with 100 fish the middle light winds from S by E we stood off and on the star. by the strong winds from S by E 2 boats went again to the star. by a fishing and caught 600. English boat left for the shore we saw 100. Lat 44 12 Long

Tuesday Jan the 14th 1845

The first of these 24 hours strong winds from S by E steering to the Northward and Westward at 6 PM stood in for a harbor on S by E side of Charlton Is. at 7 struck of light the land 12 miles off and we struck 3 times by an some sunken rocks there was French ship lying to anchor and a Dutch Barge lying off and on at 9 we kept off the middle blowing strong from S by E steering 20 E saw sail Lat 42-50

Wednesday Jan the 15th 1845

The first of these 24 hours strong winds from S by E steering 20 E by 10 the middle heavy from S by E W and equally we took in the main top gallant sail and double reefed the latter heavy winds from S by E steering 20 E Lat 40-41 Long 110-15

Twinsworth Richard Jones Master Continued

Thursday Jan the 16th 1845

The first of these 24 hours strong winds from S by E steering 20 E the middle and latter strong winds from S by E steering 20 Lat 37-21 Long

Friday Jan the 17th 1845

These 24 hours strong winds from S by E steering 20 we saw nothing Lat 34-21 Long

Saturday Jan the 18th 1845

These 24 hours strong winds from S by E steering 20 by 10 the water was rough in ships duty fine weather saw nothing Lat 31-25 Long

Sunday Jan the 19th 1845

These 24 hours light winds from S by E and fine weather the latter saw bracks and saw for them and saw nothing steering 20 E Lat 28-25 Long

Monday Jan the 20th 1845

These 24 hours light winds from S by E steering 20 E by 10 the latter the water to work a steering the gill boom fine weather saw nothing Lat 28-28 Long

Tuesday Jan the 21st 1845

The first of these 24 hours light winds from S by E steering 20 E by 10 we finished steering at the gill stay and gages the middle light winds the latter strong winds from S by E and thick weather steering 20 E by 10 Lat none

Wednesday Jan the 22nd 1845

The first of these 24 hours light winds from S by E heading 20 E we parted the main to one of the boats as the middle light winds from S by E heading 20 E the latter light winds from S by E heading 20 E by 10 we shook the boat stay and set it up fine weather Lat 23-29 Long 162-16
