

Remarks On Board Ship Herbasma

Sunday July the 13 1845

The first of these 24 hours strong winds from W by S we hauled the boats twice for whales the latter strong winds from W we hauled 3 times for whales and came on board without success we passed the Maria. One of Hobbs town

4 ships in sight Lat Long

Monday July the 14 1845

The first of these 24 hours light winds from W we hauled the boats twice for whales but had no success the latter strong winds from E S E heading S by W we hauled once for a whale we saw a number of ships saw some a bringing some a cutting and some a chasing Lat Long

Tuesday July the 15 1845

These 24 hours strong winds from W by S heading South saw nothing Lat 52-21 Long 155-10

Wednesday July the 16 1845

The first of these 24 hours strong winds from W by S heading S we saw 2 ships & a bringing at 8 P.M. we hauled ship and heading N by W the latter light winds from S W by W and ran at 8 P.M. hauled ship and stood to the South Lat Long

Thursday July the 17 1845

The first of these 24 hours light winds the latter 2 light winds S W heading S E we saw a whale and hauled for the whale he was a going quite to windward thick rainy weather

Sunday July 27 1845

The first of these 24 hours light winds and rain we commenced cutting at 8 A.M. we finished we saw a whale to windward but could not tell what they were the latter strong winds from W by N heading S S W we commenced bringing saw nothing Lat 49-37 Long 152-00

Monday July the 28 1845

The first light winds from W by S heading N by W we hauled for a whale but had no success the latter light winds from W by S W we saw a whale and hauled at 11 P.M. the Lar brook boat struck and drove ashore Lat Long

Tuesday July the 29 1845

These 24 hours light winds from S W we saw finbacks the latter we finished bringing Lat 50-33 Long

Wednesday July the 30 1845

The first of these 24 hours light winds from E S E steering W we saw a whale and hauled but did not strike the latter light winds and foggy all hands stowing down and steering to the westward Lat Long

Thursday July the 31 1845

The first of these 24 hours light winds from N heading W thick weather the latter light winds heading W we saw finbacks and a carcass we finished stowing Lat 50-40 Long 153-35
