

Remarks On Board Ship *Tha. b. m. m. k.*
Tuesday Sept the 16th 1845

The first of these 24 hours strong winds
from S E heading E the latter blowing
heavy from S E by S heading S W by S
we took in gill mizen sail and fore
top sail and double reefed to main and
mizen top sails. Lat 48-54 Long 14-15

Wednesday Sept the 17th 1845
The first of these blowing heavy
from S E heading S S W the latter
blowing a gale from S W by S heading
S E by S thick weather. Lat 49-50 Long 15-16

Thursday Sept the 18th 1845
There 24 hours blowing heavy from
S S W heading S E Lat 48-50 Long 15-16

Friday Sept the 19th 1845
The first of these 24 hours light wind
from S S W heading S E the latter
a calm we unhoist a fore top sail and
bunt another. Lat 47-50 Long 16-17

Saturday Sept the 20th 1845
The first of these 24 hours calm we
bunt fore and mizen top gallonsails and took
in the lower waist boat and put
out the S Boat at 5 P M light
winds from E steering S the latter
strong breezes from S S E heading
S W by S foggy. Lat 46-49 Long 17-18

Sunday Sept the 21st 1845
The first of these 24 hours light wind
from S by E heading S W by S raining the latter
light winds from W steering S
Lat 45-49 Long 18-19

Monday Sept the 22nd 1845
The first of these 24 hours strong
winds from W by S steering S the
latter light winds from S S W
steering S E Lat 43-46 Long 19-20

Salmon the Iceland Long Weather
Tuesday Oct the 7th 1845
The first of these 24 hours light
winds from E S E steering S W the
latter strong breezes from East
steering S W by S at 11 A M
we saw land which we supposed
to be Gay Bay. Lat 21-24 Long 14-15

Wednesday Oct the 8th 1845
The first of these 24 hours strong
breezes from E steering S W at
9 A M shortened sail and
and heeled to the wind heading
N E the latter light winds
from E S E saw the coast of
the Islands we got the anchors
of the bows and bent the chain
Morotai 3 masts. Lat 20-21 Long 15-16

Thursday Oct the 9th 1845
There 24 hours light air and calm
we are between Morotai and Jania over
a ship coming and going to Morotai.
Lat 20-21 Long 16-17

Friday Oct the 10th 1845
The first of these 24 hours light
winds from S at 4 P M we came
to anchor in Lakhina Is. under the
latter strong winds and squally
some ships arrived and some sailed.

Saturday Oct the 11th 1845
There 24 hours strong winds from
N S E at 11 A M we got underway
there was several ships down
the coast.
